

Dear Ms. Mendonca:

Thank you for forwarding copies of City Council Resolutions Nos. 125 and 126 to the Department of Environmental Management (DEM). DEM personnel have taken a number of air samples in the Olneyville area over the last several years. The results of those samples can be compiled on request.

During the last three years, DEM personnel have conducted door-to-door surveys of facilities in the Olneyville area to determine which use degreasing solvents such as trichloroethylene. All such facilities have been inspected and, when necessary, enforcement actions have been initiated in order to bring facilities with deficiencies into compliance with DEM regulations.

As was recently mentioned in the Providence Journal, Antonelli Plating Company has historically been the largest user of trichloroethylene in the Olneyville area. This facility has substantially reduced its trichloroethylene use and must be fully in compliance with DEM's Air Toxics Regulation by 15 April 1991. The company has informed DEM that it is in the process of installing a hot air dryer which will eliminate the need for trichloroethylene use.

We will continue to monitor the situation in the area and would be happy to answer any questions from the City Councilors or their constituents. I can be reached at 277-2808.


