No. 49 **AN ORDINANCE** IN AMENDMENT OF CHAPTER 1986-32, APPROVED JUNE 26, 1986, ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A COMPENSATION PLAN FOR THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE", RELATIVE TO THE PARKS ZOOLOGICAL AND SECURITY SERVICE.

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Chapter 1986-32 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, as approved June 26, 1986 is hereby further amended to read as follows:


