
Gentlemen:

The Traffic Engineering Department has reviewed the proposal to re-establish O'Neil Street as a two way street and to eliminate the parking on the southerly side of the street.

Since this street was established as a one way street in July of 1962 we have had numerous complaints from residents of the area regarding motorists using the street in the wrong direction in spite of fully adequate signing and the increase in traffic on the adjacent street, Concannon Street, which is very narrow and without sidewalks.

In view of these difficulties and the importance of O'Neil Street as a connector between Douglas Avenue and Veazie Street it is therefore recommended that O'Neil Street be re-established as a two way street and that parking be eliminated along the southerly side of O'Neil Street from Douglas Avenue to Veazie Street.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the assassination of John Fitzgerald Kennedy, Thirty-fifth President of the United States of America evoked a multitude of suggestions for memorials, and

WHEREAS, to properly consider the many suggestions which were introduced into the City Council, by certain of its members, and of suggestions transmitted to the Executive Department by persons mourning the passing of this great American President, the City Council created a Special Committee for the purpose of considering suggestions for an appropriate permanent monument to the late President, and

WHEREAS, this Committee did meet and deliberate upon three occasions discussing at length the various Resolutions of the City Council referred to it; the several written suggestions submitted to it by way of correspondence from interested persons sent to the Mayor's Office and the further suggestion that a memorial be erected in Roger Williams Park, and

WHEREAS, following meetings of that Special Committee it is the consensus that the most appropriate memorial, at this time, would be the renaming of Exchange Place, where the late President last appeared in Providence and addressed a vast crowd.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the area of downtown Providence, presently designated as "Exchange Place" be redesignated and dedicated as "Kennedy Plaza", in memory of John Fitzgerald Kennedy, Thirty-fifth President of the United States of America, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT ^{an v.} appropriate dedicatory ceremony be arranged by this Special Committee and ^{be v.} conducted on Friday, May 29, 1964, upon which day the late President John Fitzgerald Kennedy would have celebrated, with the Nation, his forty-seventh birthday.
