

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Approved September 21, 1987

WHEREAS, Joseph Stanley Nachajski and Margaret Mildred Ginnerty were both born in Providence, Rhode Island and have resided in Providence for all of their seventy odd years, and

WHEREAS, Joseph was the second son of Frank (Andrez) Nachajski and Mary Rosen Nachajski. Margaret was the third child of Patrick Ginnerty and Ella Mulligan Ginnerty-Sheridan, and

WHEREAS, Both Margaret and Joseph attended Providence Public Schools including Laurel Hill Avenue, Asa Messer, George West Junior High, and the former Commercial High School, and

WHEREAS, Joe was a baseball player and a pretty well-known one in the days of the Providence Amateur League. He was a catcher and played with the monarch team and the South Providence Grays among others. He was also later a coach. During Joe's Amateur league baseball days spanning a time period of 1920 to 1940's Joe's last name was shortened to Naski by the late local sports announcer Warren Walden who had difficulty pronouncing Nachajski, and

WHEREAS, Margaret and Joe met at a baseball game. They were married in the Cathedral of Saints Peter and Paul on Saturday, September 4, 1937 at 8:15 A.M., and

WHEREAS, Joe was employed for over 40 years at the General Electric Base Plant on Atwells Avenue in Providence before retiring in 1972. He was very active in the AFL-CIO as a Union Steward and Vice-President, and

WHEREAS, Margaret and Joe reside at 10 Grover Street in Providence where they have lived since 1956, the home which Joe's parents had owned since the 1920's, and

WHEREAS, They are the parents of one daughter, Carol Nachajski Misenor and the grandparents of Jennifer Anne, Katie Elizabeth and Amy Margaret Misenor, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Members of the City Council do express heartfelt congratulations to Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Stanley Nachajski on the occasion of their Fiftieth Wedding Anniversary.
