RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, RHODE ISLAND, TO FILE A STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVES AND FUNDING UNDER THE HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACT.

WHEREAS, the City of Providence is eligible to receive Community Development Block Grant Entitlement Funds for fiscal year ending June 1990 under Section 106(a) or (h) of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1987 and;

WHEREAS, the Statement of Objectives and Funding shall be filed with the Boston Regional Office of the Department of Housing and Urban Development as soon as possible.

NOW THEREFORE, The City Council of the City of Providence, County of Providence, State of Rhode Island, hereby authorize the City of Providence, through its official representative, the Mayor, to file a STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVES AND FUNDING with the Boston Area Office of the Department of Housing and Urban Development for the purpose of obtaining Community Development Block Grant Funds.

PROPOSED ALLOCATIONS FOR NEIGHBORHOOD BASED HOUSING AGENCIES

PROGRAM YEAR 15 (JULY 1989 - JUNE 1990)

ALLOCATION METHODOLOGY

Neighborhood based nonprofit housing organizations have been a component of the City's overall housing programs for many years. There are substantial differences among these agencies with regard to purpose, style and program elements. But the 12 agencies for which funding is proposed share many similar characteristics. These agencies are small organizations with staff resources of three persons or less. The cost of maintaining these agencies are also quite similar. For most of this nonprofit network, their budgets and staffs are in place while a few are in the start-up stage.

The budget amounts proposed here attempt to provide assistance in a balanced manner. Over time, allocations for these agencies have grown in a haphazard manner. Some agencies received a greater yearly allocation of funds than other quite similar agencies. This proposed budget begins to move the allocations to a more balanced level and also takes into consideration the factors of funding history and program mission.

The proposed total funding made available to the nonprofit housing groups is \$509,000. The requests received exceeded available funds by a great deal, unfortunately CDBG is a limited and shrinking funding resource. While several nonprofits have requests for loan funds or development funds, none of these are proposed for funding. The proposed allocations provide in all but one case administrative funds only. Administrative funds are the most difficult for organizations to raise. In addition, CDBG funding of administrative requests may be critical to agency survival. The unfunded program requests can be met by these organizations, in part, by the utilization of other programs administered by the City, State and the Rhode Island Housing and Mortgage Finance Corporation.

CHALLENGE GRANT ALLOCATION

Our budget presentation also contains a challenge grant program for the first time. Under this program, we proposed to make 80% of an agencies allocation available during the program year, with no match requirements. The remaining 20% of the allocation will be available based on evidence of one for one matching funds. It is imperative that nonprofit groups be encouraged to raise additional funds. This challenge program will offer agencies the chance to approach other funding sources with the offer to match their contribution with City funds.

I. ELMWOOD FOUNDATION

The Elmwood Foundation will receive funding for the administration of its program of housing rehabilitation with emphasis on the historic character of the Elmwood neighborhood. This year, the Elmwood Foundation has restructured its program to more closely meet the HUD definition of a housing program.

PROPOSED ALLOCATION: \$51,000

II. ELMWOOD NEIGHBORHOOD HOUSING SERVICES (ENHS)

ENHS is part of the national NHS network. ENHS assists Elmwood residents improve their homes, coordinates various neighborhood improvement projects, and most recently has been constructing homes for low and moderate income families.

Funds have been provided to assist with ongoing program administration and to provide a commercial revitalization specialist for Broad Street.

PROPOSED ALLOCATION: \$55,000

III. GOOD NEWS HOUSING

Good News Housing develops limited equity housing for low income families. The housing is built on land owned by a land trust which assures its continued use for low income family housing. To date, SWAP has acted as the general contractor on Good News Housing's projects. Good News has produced (7) units of housing (Comstock Street (12); Prairie Avenue (3); and Superior Street (2).

Good News is one of our newest housing nonprofits and has been very successful in promoting cooperative units on Land Trust land.

PROPOSED ALLOCATION: \$45,000

IV. HMONG HOMEOWNERSHIP REVOLVING FUND

This new program will provide deferred loans of \$2,000 to Hmong families purchasing property in the City of Providence. The City has never directly assisted this group. This assistance will continue an already existing program and assist with the purchase of property by family members in a version of cooperative ownership.

PROPOSED ALLOCATION: \$10,000

V. OLNEYVILLE HOUSING CORPORATION

The Olneyville Housing Corporation is a new organization which seeks to generate resources for housing rehabilitation and overall neighborhood revitalization in a target area within the Olneyville neighborhood. The proposed allocation for administration will allow the agency to grow as an independent agency for Olneyville.

PROPOSED ALLOCATION: \$41,000

VI. OMNI DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

We propose to fund Omni Development for administration expenses to encourage the development of additional affordable housing units and to support the Contractors Assistance Program.

PROPOSED ALLOCATION: \$70,000

VII. PPS REVOLVING FUND

The PPS Revolving Fund provides rehabilitation technical assistance and gap financing to assist homeowners with the restoration of homes in three target areas located in the Armory District, North Elmwood and Upper South Providence.

The proposed allocation will continue to fund the administration of this program.

PROPOSED ALLOCATION: \$55,000

VIII. SMITH HILL HOUSING COORDINATION

The position of Housing Coordinator has provided a full time outreach and rehabilitation information program for the Smith Hill neighborhood. CDBG funds are matched already by United Way funds.

PROPOSED ALLOCATION: \$15,000

IX. STOP WASTING ABANDONED PROPERTY (SWAP)

SWAP concentrates on providing homeownership opportunities for primarily lower income families. In the past, these opportunities revolved around the rehabilitation of abandoned properties by SWAP homesteaders. SWAP now builds and rehabilitates properties in Providence's lower income neighborhoods.

We propose funding of SWAP administration at prior year's level.

PROPOSED ALLOCATION: \$75,000

X. WEST BROADWAY INCENTIVE CORPORATION

This small agency offers outreach and program coordination services to homeowners and tenants in West Broadway. We propose to fund the administration of this program.

PROPOSED ALLOCATION: \$16,000

XI. WEST ELMWOOD HOUSING CORPORATION

This is a new agency which experienced some start-up problems in the last year. We propose funding contingent upon the hiring of a full time executive director.

PROPOSED ALLOCATION: \$30,000

XII. WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION (WDC)

WDC packages various housing subsidy programs to develop mid-size to large affordable housing developments for itself and others. WDC does project development through its for profit Women's Opportunity Realty Corporation. Their most recent projects are the 48 unit Indian Village and a 12 unit turn key public housing development.

PROPOSED ALLOCATION: \$46,000

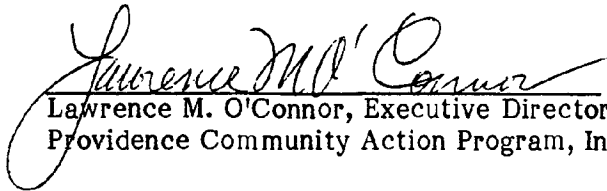

Subject: '89-'90 CDBG Public Service Recommendations

The attached report was prepared under the terms and conditions of our Public Service Management Contract (#699-14) and constitutes our official recommendations for use of Community Development Public Service funds available for the period of July 1, 1989 through June 30, 1990.

At the present time, 47 public service activities are being operated by 28 non-profit social service agencies. There are \$1,433,560 in CDBG funds allocated for this purpose. In addition, \$91,500 has been appropriated for Pro-CAP's Public Service Management Contract. Therefore, a total of \$1,525,060 in CDBG funds has been allocated for the period of July 1, 1988 through June 30, 1989.

In response to our March 17th request for proposals 27 current grantees applied for renewal funding in the amount of \$1,429,120. In addition, 10 new initiatives were proposed totaling \$530,447. It should be noted that 8 agencies increased their request beyond current funding levels in the amount of \$291,110 (\$184,588 representing new initiatives). If Pro-CAP's public service management contract was to be renewed for \$90,000 and proposals for new initiatives and renewals were added together, \$2,144,155 in requests would be the total considered for support for the period of July 1, 1989 through June 30, 1990.
