NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor be and he hereby is requested to join with the Governor in procuring studies to be made of methods of preventing future flooding of downtown and other areas of the City due to hurricane winds and tidal waves, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor offer the cooperation of the City and all its departments to private groups making similar studies.
