


WHEREAS, the City of Providence is desirous of purchasing certain items for the use of the City of Providence which items are purchased on a regular basis by other cities and towns, and

WHEREAS, the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island 45-5-20 allow cities and towns to enter into intermunicipal agreements for joint purchasing of common use items.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That pursuant to 45-5-20 of the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island his Honor the Mayor is hereby authorized to establish such intermunicipal agreements for the joint purchase of common use items with such other municipalities who adopt such enabling resolution on such terms and conditions as may be approved by His Honor the Mayor.

FURTHER RESOLVED, His Honor the Mayor, pursuant to 45-5-20, is hereby authorized to enter into such agreements as may seek the services of the Division of Purchasing, Department of Administration, in procuring items necessary to the operation of the City of Providence and which items are common in usage to those procured by the State.

45-5-20. Power of city and town councils to establish intermunicipal agreements for joint purchasing of common use items. — City and town councils may, through passage of a resolution, establish joint agreements between two (2) or more municipalities for the purpose of purchasing materials, supplies, tools and other items common in usage between said units of local government. City or town councils may, through resolution, agree to seek the services of the division of purchases, department of administration, in procuring items necessary to the operation of the city or town which it governs and which items are common in usage to those procured by the state.

45-5-21. Power of city and town councils to appropriate funds granted by the federal government. — In addition to the powers heretofore granted by charter or the public laws of the state especially relating thereto, the city council of any city and the town council of any town, is hereby authorized, through passage of an ordinance to appropriate and obligate funds received by said city or town from the federal government under the provisions of Title II — Anti-Recession Provisions, Local Public Works Act of 1976.
