

Dear Mayor:

During the fiscal year 1953-4 the Office of the Recorder of Deeds received for record 19,108 documents, including 214 Military Discharges.

For the same period we received in fees tendered in payment therefor \$32,308.85.

The expenses of this Office for the same period were \$57,713.76, leaving a deficit of expenditures over receipts of \$25,404.91.

It seems opportune at this time to point out that we have consistently recommended that inasmuch as this Office offers a specialized service to a certain class of the public, that our fees should be substantially increased to reflect not only the marked increase in cost of materials and services rendered, but also the considerable cost of maintaining the records of the Office for all future generations.

The fees we now assess were established by State Statute in 1927, and at that time were adequate to meet the foreseeable needs to make the Office of the Recorder of Deeds financially independent of Council appropriations.

Our neighboring State of Massachusetts has not only increased their fees by more than fifty percent, but has also levied a tax on real estate transfers, which affords additional revenue to the Town or City in which the transfer of property takes place.

A multimillion dollar deed, if within the statutory limits in regard to the number of words involved still costs but \$2.00 to record for all future generations. Is this fair to the average citizen who must pay increased taxes to make up the deficit to maintain such records?

Recently all the records of this Office were placed on microfilm with the idea of preserving the records in some place outside the City in case of disaster, and also of displacing certain of our older records with microfilm copies thereof to conserve space.

The cost of this project was \$16,238.00. It seems ill-fitting that the general taxpayer should bear the brunt of these additional appropriations. We would like to be self-sufficient.

I would urgently suggest that the City Solicitor be authorized to appear before the present session of the State Legislature to substantially increase the fees of this Office so that we may again be in a position to pay our own way and be financially independent of general tax monies.
