*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

SECTION 1: The Zoning Map accompanying and made a part of Chapter 544 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved September 21, 1951, as heretofore amended, and entitled "An Ordinance Zoning the City of Providence and Establishing Use, Height, and Area Regulations" by changing from an R-3 General Residence Zone to a C-1 Limited Commercial Zone, Lot 170 as set out and delineated on City Assessor's Plat 102; said lot being located on the southeasterly corner of Veazie and Shiloh Streets, and designated as 299 Veazie Street, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at the southeasterly corner of Veazie and Shiloh Streets; thence easterly along the southerly line of Shiloh Street to the northeasterly corner of Lot 170 on Assessor's Plat 102; thence southerly along the westerly line of Lot 68 to the southeasterly corner of Lot 170; thence westerly along the southerly line of said Lot 170 to the northeasterly line of Veazie Street and the southwesterly corner of said Lot 170; thence northwesterly along the said northeasterly line of Veazie Street to the southeasterly corner of Veazie and Shiloh Streets and the point and place of beginning.

SEC. 2: This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

SUBJECT: REFERRAL NO. 669 - ZONING CHANGE AT 299 VEAZIE STREET

Gentlemen:

The subject referral received consideration by the City Plan Commission at a meeting held on Wednesday, December 15, 1954.

This referral is a request for a change in zoning from an R-3 Zone to a C-1 Zone of Lot 170 on Assessor's Plat 102 located at 299 Veazie Street, and containing a total of 19,608 square feet.


Reference is made to Referral No. 67, from the Committee on City Property, dated May 17, 1946, at which time a request of the Wanskuck Post 56 A.L. to purchase Lot 170 on Assessor's Plat 102 was made. At that time the Commission recommended approval and the sale was subsequently approved by the City Council.

On the field trip it was found that the lot in question is presently vacant with the exception of the Wanskuck Post Stone Memorial Marker located on the north-west corner. While the opposite side of Veazie Street, from the property in question, is occupied by business uses in residential structures the surrounding area is nevertheless preponderantly residential. In view of the city's refusal to grant similar changes in zoning in the immediate neighborhood, and in order to protect the residential character of the area and prevent spot zoning

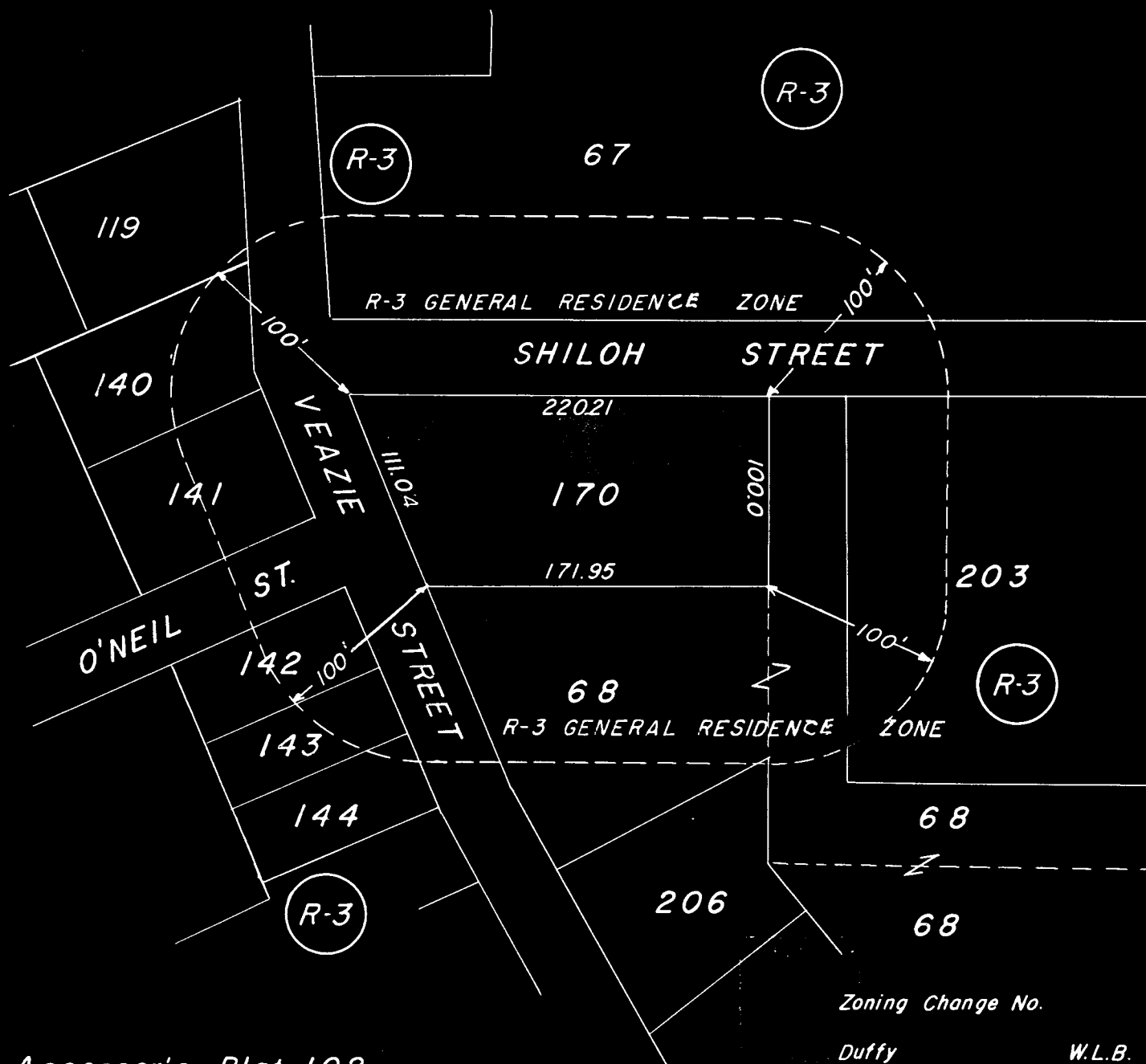

Gentlemen:

The subject referral received consideration by the City Plan Commission on Monday, May 16, 1955.

This referral is a request for a change in zoning from a C-4 Zone to a C-1 Zone of Lot 129 on Assessor's Plat 31 located on the northeasterly corner of Cranston and Ford Streets. The area in question contains 7,510 square feet of land.

On the field trip it was found that the area is occupied by a drive-in retail ice cream outlet.


Reference is made to Referral No. 443, from the Committee on Ordinances, dated September 24, 1952, which requested a zoning change from an R-3 Zone to a C-4 Zone. It was recommended that a C-4 change be denied but offered no objection to the granting of a C-1 Zone. Subsequent action by the City Council granted the C-4 use.

VOTED: To offer no objection to the granting of this petition provided the C-1 Zone is limited to a distance of 100 feet from the street line.

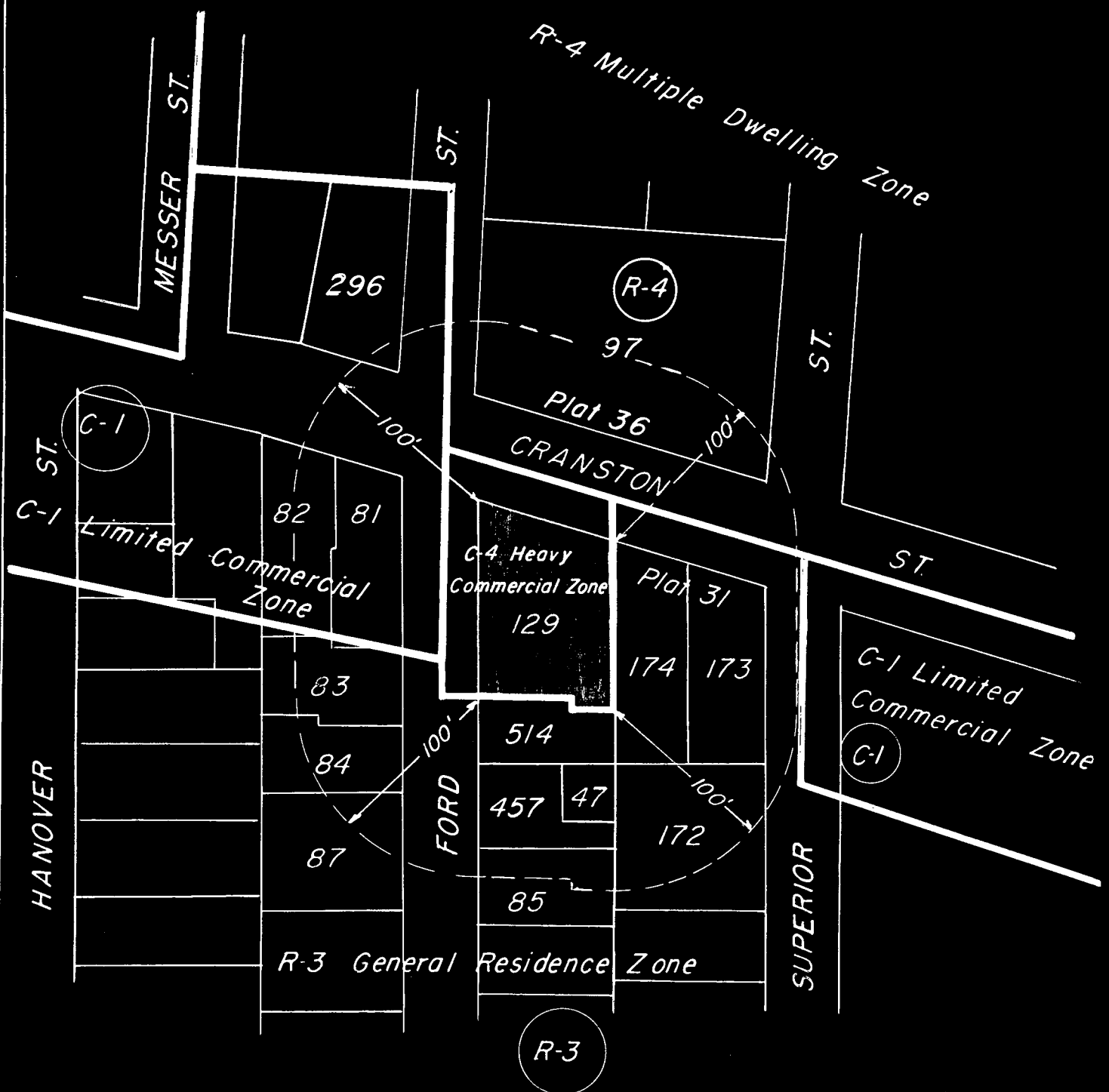

No. 382 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF CERTAIN QUESTIONS TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY AT A SPECIAL ELECTION ON JUNE 9, 1955.

Approved June 3, 1955

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

SECTION 1. The Board of Canvassers and Registration is hereby authorized and directed to provide and arrange for a Special Election to be held in the City of Providence on Thursday, June 9, 1955 at which election the following questions shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the City of Providence.

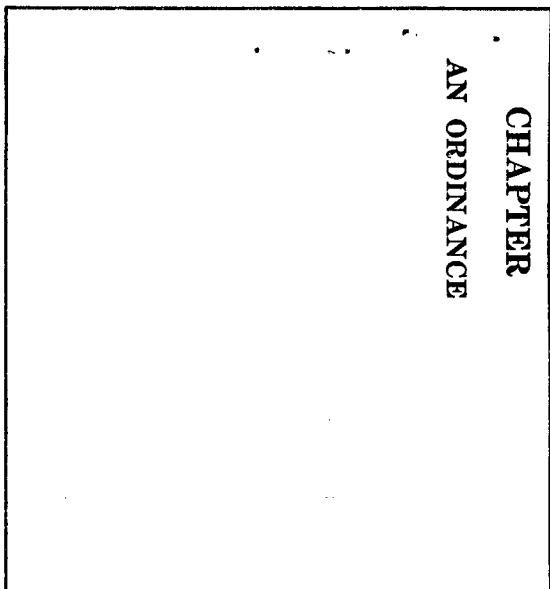
1.. Shall Chapter 3545 of the Public Laws of Rhode Island, April 27, 1955 be approved and the City of Providence be authorized to issue bonds pursuant to said Chapter, in a sum not exceeding One Million Five Hundred Thousand (\$1,500,000) Dollars for the payment of obligations of the City incurred for the relief of its inhabitants and the preservation of municipal property in the emergency caused by the hurricane of August 31, 1954?

2. Shall the City of Providence be authorized to issue bonds in a sum not exceeding Two Million Five Hundred Thousand (\$2,500,000) Dollars for the Redevelopment Revolving Fund authorized by the provisions of Section 49 of Chapter 2574 of the Public Laws of Rhode Island, 1950, in addition to the Two Million (\$2,000,000) Dollars in bonds heretofore authorized?

SEC. 2. Said election shall be held in conformity with the election laws of the State of Rhode Island, except in the following particulars as authorized by Chapter 3526 of the Public Laws of Rhode Island, approved May 5, 1955, entitled "An Act Excepting Certain Special Elections in the City of Providence from the Election Laws of the State in Certain Respects."

(1) The warrant providing for said referendum shall be issued at least 10 days before the date fixed for said referendum and need not be posted as otherwise provided by law, but the same shall be posted by publication in a daily newspaper having local circulation.

(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, paper ballots shall be used in lieu of voting machines.

(3) The number of polling places to be provided for shall be not less than 3 nor more than 6 for each ward.

(4) The number of officials for each polling place shall be not less than 4 nor more than 8.

(5) One check list of voters shall be used at each voting place in lieu of the customary two check lists.

SEC. 3. The City Clerk is directed to transmit to the Secretary of State forthwith upon the passage of this Ordinance, a certified copy thereof, and the Secretary of State is thereupon authorized and requested to place upon the ballot the aforesaid questions.

SEC. 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, and Chapter 936 of the Ordinances, approved March 4, 1955, and all other ordinances, resolutions and parts of either inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
