

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 395

Approved April 26, 1979

WHEREAS, Due to the breakdown of the Providence Sewerage Treatment Plant, billions of gallons of raw sewage flowed into the Narragansett Bay, and

WHEREAS, Concerned citizens and officials from communities surrounding the Bay have formed a coalition designed to protect their interests as well as the Bay, and

WHEREAS, In the past month, thirteen coastal Cities and Towns have adopted Resolutions to join the coalition, and Providence being the prime problem area, is not on that list, and

WHEREAS, Joseph W. Walsh, Mayor of Warwick, the prime mover of the coalition, views it as a sounding board for communities of our State who have a common interest,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the City of Providence is hereby requested to join with the thirteen Cities and Towns in their coalition to regulate and control the pollution in Narragansett Bay.
