


The Providence Fire Department Combat Challenge Team competed in **World Challenge XI** which was held October 29, 2002 through November 2, 2002 in Deerfield Beach, Florida. The Firefighter Combat Challenge is a race against the clock by firefighters that perform the following series of five routine firefighting tasks in a specific order:

EVENT 1: High Rise Pack Carry. The competition starts at the base of a tower. The hose pack cannot be touched before the start. The 3"-in. hose load and cover that weighs 45 lb. may be carried in any manner and must be deposited into a container on the top floor (sixty steps).

EVENT 2: Hose Hoist. A 45-lb. roll of large diameter hose is hoisted up the tower using 5/8"-in. kernmantle rope. The evolution is complete when the roll clears the railing at the top of the tower and the hose is placed in container on the top floor.

EVENT 3: Forcible Entry. The forcible entry evolution utilizes the Keiser Force Machine™ (a chopping simulator). Using the 9-lb. shot mallet (sledge hammer), the competitor must drive the 160-lb. steel beam a horizontal distance of 5-ft.

EVENT 4: Hose Advance. Traveling 140-ft. through course delimiters, the competitor must then pick up the nozzle end of the 1.75-in. charged hose line and drag it a distance of 75-ft. Once the nozzle crosses the 75-ft. stripe, the competitor opens the nozzle, hits a target with the water stream, shuts down the nozzle and places the nozzle on the pavement.

EVENT 5: Victim Rescue. A 175-lb. Simulaid, Inc., Rescue Randy® mannequin must be dragged backwards a distance of 100-ft. Carrying the dummy is not permitted.

To qualify for the World Challenge, competitors had to qualify at one of several regional competitions that were held throughout the United States and Canada. The Providence Fire Department Combat Challenge Team consisted of 4 male Providence Firefighters and one Firefighter from the Warwick Fire Department. Additionally, there are two female firefighters that competed individually, the Fire Marshal competed with the team and individually in the Chief's division, and our team coach competed individually in the over 50 year old division. The following are the team members:

All the firefighters on the Providence Fire Department Combat Challenge Team recorded times that achieved a personal best. In addition, Lieutenant Chuck LeBlanc, the Team Coach, and Fire Marshal David Costa both qualified as individuals for the final competition that was held on Saturday, November 2, 2002. Lieutenant Chuck LeBlanc finished in 8th place in the over-50 age group and Fire Marshal David Costa finished 7th in Chief's division. The final competition will be aired on ESPN some time around December 23, 2002.
