## REPORTS FROM COMMITTEES

### COUNCILMAN ROBERT M. CLARKIN, Chairman COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC WORKS

**Transmits the following with recommendation the same be severally Approved:**

Resolution Authorizing His Honor, the Mayor, to execute a Memorandum of Agreement permitting the United States of America to market the India Point Bridge for a period of thirty (30) days prior to its demolition.

Resolution No. 683, approved October 13, 2000 is hereby rescinded.

*Whereas*, The City of Providence is the owner of the India Point Bridge; and

*Whereas*, Said bridge was originally designed for railway travel; and

*Whereas*, Said bridge is no longer utilized for such travel; and

*Whereas*, Said bridge presents a hazard for navigation; and

*Whereas*, The City in conjunction with the federal government is planning the dismantling and removal of said bridge; and

*Whereas*, As part of that Agreement between the City of Providence and the United States of America, title to said bridge shall be transferred to the Federal Government; and

*Whereas*, The federal government seeks the approval of the city to market the bridge for a period of thirty (30) days prior to its demolition,

*Now, therefore, be it Resolved*, That His Honor, the Mayor, is authorized to transfer ownership of the India Point Bridge to the United States of America for the sum of zero dollars (\$0.00) and further authorized to negotiate conditions of sale and to execute any and all documents to effect such transfer substantially in the form as exhibited in attachment "A".

*Be it further Resolved*, That His Honor, the Mayor, is authorized to execute a memorandum of agreement permitting the United States of America to market the bridge for a period of thirty (30) days prior to its demolition. (A photocopy of that agreement is exhibited in attachment "B").

Said abandonment is specifically conditioned precedent upon the following:

1. Petitioner shall convey an easement acceptable to the Narragansett Electric Company which will permit retention of its facilities in their existing location, together with the right to inspect, maintain, operate and replace the same and with twenty-four hour access to said facilities, or in the alternative should it be determined by the petitioner that any such facilities need be relocated in order to comply with an intended use, the Petitioner shall assume all costs of relocation.

2. Petitioner shall convey an easement acceptable to Providence Gas Company which will permit retention of its facilities in their existing location, together with the right to inspect, maintain, operate and replace the same and with twenty-four hour access to said facilities, or in the alternative should it be determined by the petitioner that any such facilities need be relocated in order to comply with an intended use, the Petitioner shall assume all costs of relocation.

3. Petitioner shall convey an easement acceptable to Bell Atlantic Company which will

permit retention of its facilities in their existing location, together with the right to inspect, maintain, operate and replace the same and with twenty-four hour access to said facilities, or in the alternative should it be determined by the petitioner that any such facilities need be relocated in order to comply with an intended use, the Petitioner shall assume all costs of relocation.

4. The City of Providence shall retain for itself, its heirs, successors and assigns full sewer easements in the abandoned streets which will permit retention of its facilities in their existing location, together with the right to inspect, maintain, operate and replace the same and with twenty-four hour access to said facilities, or in the alternative should it be determined by the petitioner that any such facilities need be relocated in order to comply with an intended use, the Petitioner shall assume all costs of relocation.

5. Petitioner shall meet the conditions to which reference is made in that communication from the Providence Water Supply Board dated September 29, 1998.

6. The Department of Planning and Development shall obtain final City Council approval for the entirety of the Department of Public Safety Complex.

*Ordered,* That the Traffic Engineer be and he is hereby directed to cause a sign to be placed on the above-named highway abandoned as aforesaid, having thereon the words, "Not a Public Highway", and it is further

For a period of five (5) years the roadway design alterations on Exhibit A attached hereto may be installed.

During the five (5) year period:

The police and fire department shall bi-annually report the impact, if any, of the alterations upon its public safety duties, together with any other comments the Chiefs of these departments think relevant.

The traffic engineer shall bi-annually report the impact, if any, of the alterations upon parking availability, traffic flow and motor vehicle accidents, together with any other comments he/she think relevant.

The Department of Public Works shall bi-annually report the impact, if any, of the

alterations upon snow removal, street sweeping, trash removal and road maintenance, together with any other comments he/she think relevant.

The Department of Planning and Development shall maintain and report bi-annual basis comments, if any, offered by the targeted neighborhood residents. The Department of Planning and Development shall also develop contingency plans for the determination of funds that may be required for the removal of said alterations.

At the end of the five-year trial period, if not sooner terminated, the Department of Planning and Development shall submit to the City Council for review and final approval or denial the roadway alteration design.
