# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 399

Approved August 4, 1976

WHEREAS, it is evident that no effort has been made, nor is there any evidence that any program is proposed to repaint designated crosswalks and/or guidelines within the Sixth Ward of the City of Providence by the Traffic Engineer, and

WHEREAS, albeit, the staff of the said Department, during certain public celebrations, have appropriately painted certain City Streets, in honor of such celebrations, and

WHEREAS, while the sponsor of this Resolution, Councilman Vincent J. Cirelli, finds no quarrel with the official acknowledgement and participation of public celebrations, it is incumbent upon him to be concerned with the welfare of his constituency within the Sixth Ward and of all the people who traverse its highways,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Traffic Engineer is fervently requested to undertake a program, forthwith for the painting of each and all designated crosswalks and/or guidelines, within the Sixth Ward of Providence, so that possible injury to persons and damage to motor vehicles be minimized, or better still, non-existent.
