**WHEREAS**, On March 1, 2020, Rhode Island Public Health Foundation opened its clinic, Open Door Health, located at 7 Central Street; and

**WHEREAS**, Rhode Island Public Health Foundation offers clinical services through its Open Door Health program that include comprehensive primary care and sexual health services, as well as HIV care and gender-affirming care; and

**WHEREAS**, The organization provides care to all patients regardless of their ability to pay; and

**WHEREAS**, The new Open Door Health program at the Rhode Island Public Health Foundation in Providence will provide space for 6,500 more patients to the organization, creating 40 full-time, sustainable paying jobs; and

**WHEREAS**, The Rhode Island Public Health Foundation also hosts a variety of food insecurity programs that serve needy Rhode Islanders and promote healthy eating, including Food on the Move, one of the nation's largest mobile produce programs, and NOURISH Rhode Island, a hunger alleviation advocacy coalition; and

**WHEREAS**, The new Open Door Health location will allow Rhode Island Public Health Foundation to better reduce health disparities across the state.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, That the City Council of the City of Providence does hereby support Rhode Island Public Health Foundation and its expansion of services with a new facility in the city of Providence and the effort to exempt the real and tangible personal property taxes of the organization under Rhode Island General Law § 44-3-3.

## **PERSONAL EXPRESSION**

### **COUNCILMAN NARDUCCI Requests the privilege of the floor to speak on a Point of Personal Expression and states:**

"It was an honor to be there today at the wreath laying of the ceremony with the Providence Police honoring the members of the Providence Police Department whose lives were lost in the line of duty and also the officers that have retired and passed on. Since 2021 until 2022 there was a father/son combination, Eddy Malloy and his son. There was also a gentleman Anthony Negrete from neighborhood on Langdon Street. Eddy Malloy, Sr. and Anthony Negrete, they were the first two motorcycle cops in the City of Providence and it was kind of weird how they died approximately six months apart from each other both due to cancer. It is National Police Week throughout the country and what I would like to have, is I would like to have maybe a 30 second moment of silence to think and to pray for the families and the officers whose lives were taken in the line of duty or who have lost their lives. It was said by Chief Clements today, how over 753 officers were shot in the line of duty in the last two years. That was up 75% and that was throughout the country and it kind of makes you think. They put that badge on and they are out there to save and to secure us from any bad doings or bad people and here they are when their lives get lost it doesn't just affect the officer. I look out at many families, Cornel Young's family, the Shaw's family, the Malloy's. Maxwell, his son played football for me, he was probably one of the best that I've known as a father, as someone who volunteered his time coaching football. It's just sad, and I think it's proper that we all just keep them in our thought and prayers, their families moving forward and there are programs available if you want to look and see which officers from Providence were affected since 2021. 2020 and 2021 they didn't have the wreath laying because of COVID and everything else going on. It was nice to be able to get it done again today and to honor the members again of the Providence Police Department. Thank you."
