**Be it ordained by the City of Providence:**

SECTION 1: Section 15-2 (a) of the Code of Ordinances of the City  
of Providence is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 15-2. Penalties for traffic violations.

(a) Generally. The general penalties provided for by section 1-10  
of this Code of Ordinances, shall apply to violations of this chapter  
or any regulations made thereunder except that any person electing to  
appear before the clerk of court, instead of making a personal ap-  
pearance before the police court and admitting the violation charged,  
shall be punished by a fine as hereinafter respectively set forth:

## CHAPTER 69-19

No. 241 **AN ORDINANCE** IN AMENDMENT OF ARTICLE IV OF CHAPTER 13 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, ENTITLED "HOUSING", AS AMENDED, PROVIDING FOR A LANDLORD-TENANT ESCROW ACCOUNT.

Approved May 2, 1969

**Be it ordained by the City of Providence:**

SECTION 1. Section IV of Chapter 13 of The Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding thereto a new section, as follows:

**13-102. Payment of Rent Into Escrow Account**

(a) Notwithstanding any lease or other agreement between a landlord and tenant or tenants, if the director shall have ordered the repair, alteration or improvement of a dwelling under the provisions of this section or under the provisions of section 13-39 of Article II hereof in that he has given notice that the same constitutes a direct or serious hazard or immediate peril to the health, safety or welfare of the occupants, then the obligations of paying the rent therefor to the landlord shall be suspended and the tenant or tenants shall pay the rent into an escrow account hereby established in the Division of Minimum Housing Standards and said rent monies paid into the escrow account may thereafter be paid by the director to any person authorized to make repairs, including the director himself and the landlord, said payment to defray the cost of correcting the conditions complained of.

(b) No action shall be maintained by the landlord against the tenant or tenants for such rent which is paid into the above created escrow account, nor shall any action be maintained by the landlord for possession of said premises if the tenant follows the provisions of this section.

(c) Rental payments paid into said escrow account in excess of those necessary to make repairs shall be paid to the landlord on completion of the repairs as determined by the director. As each rental period is completed the tenant shall pay into said escrow account the amount of the rent then due and if the tenant fails to make payments in accordance with the rental period to the director, then the landlord may maintain an action for rent or possession subject to such defenses as the tenant may have under the lease or agreement for rental of the premises and subject to other provisions of law.

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

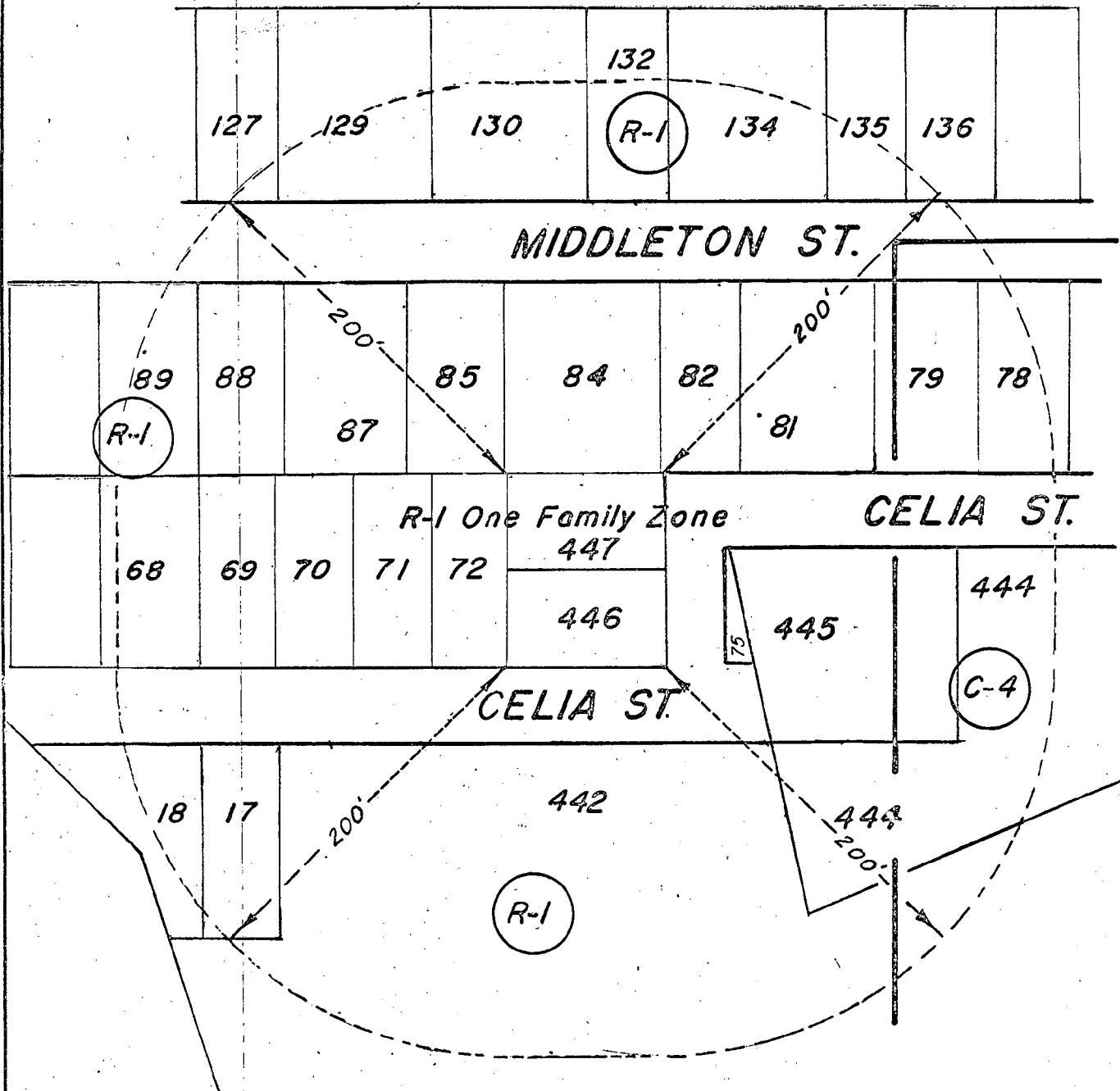

Gentlemen:

The subject referral received consideration by the City Plan Commission at a meeting held on Tuesday, October 8, 1968.

This referral is a request to change the zoning of Lots 446 and 447 on Assessor's Plat 114 on Celia Street from R-1 to R-2.

Attention is directed to Referral No. 1647 dated 10/13/67 which requests the same zoning change on the same property (at that time identified as Lots 73 and 74).

Following is an excerpt from Referral No. 1647:

"On an inspection and photographic survey it was determined that Lots 73 and 74 were undeveloped and vacant except for a few automobiles parking on these lots. The surrounding area is in very good condition consisting mostly of one-family ranch houses.

The present and proposed zone for this area is R-1 low density residential zone. It is important that the Ordinance be upheld as a means of assuring stability to the one-family zone. Converting these two lots into an R-2 Zone would change the land use characteristics of this low density residential zone and could affect property values and the environmental character of the neighborhood. ## AN ACT

IN AMENDMENT OF SECTION 17 OF CHAPTER 1665 OF THE PUBLIC LAWS OF 1945  
ENTITLED "THE PROVIDENCE FINANCE ACT", CHANGING THE FISCAL YEAR  
OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE.

*It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 17 of Chapter 1665 of the Public Laws of 1945, entitled "The Providence Finance Act" is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 17. The 1969-1970 fiscal year of the city government shall begin on the first day of October, 1969 and shall end on the 30th day of June, 1970, and thereafter the fiscal year of the City shall begin on the first day of July and shall end on the 30th day of June. Such fiscal year shall constitute the budget and accounting year. As used herein, the term "budget year" shall mean any fiscal year for which any particular budget is administered. Taxes shall be due and payable on a day fixed by resolution but not later than the 30th day following the beginning of each fiscal year. The Council shall also determine by resolution the installments in which taxes may be paid, the dates on which penalties for non-payment shall apply, and the rate of such penalties.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage and all acts or parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Approved May 2, 1969

RESOLVED, That the City Council of the City of Providence hereby orders the assessment and collection of a tax on the ratable real estate and tangible personal property and ratable intangible personal property (the tax on ratable intangible property to be at the rate of forty cents on each one hundred dollars of the value thereof) in a sum not less than \$34,000,000 nor more than \$41,000,000; said tax is for ordinary expenses, charges for the payment of interest and indebtedness in whole or in part of said City, and for other purposes authorized by law.

The City Assessor shall assess and apportion said tax on the inhabitants and ratable property of said City as of the 31st day of December, A.D. 1968, at twelve o'clock, noon, Eastern Standard Time, according to law, and shall on completion of said assessment, date and sign the same, and shall make out and certify to the City Collector of the City of Providence, on or before the 15th day of June, A.D. 1969, a complete list of the names of the persons taxed and of the total value of all the real estate taxes to each person, the amount of personal estate except manufacturers' machinery and equipment, assessed against each person, also the amount of manufacturers' machinery and equipment and also the total amount of the tax assessed against each person on said real estate and personal estate, opposite the name of the person or persons assessed, the assessment of real estate, personal estate and manufacturers' machinery and equipment to appear in separate columns in said list. Said tax shall be due and payable on and between the 1st day of October, next, and the twenty-fourth day of October, A.D. 1969, next, and all taxes remaining unpaid on said last named day shall carry until collected a penalty at the rate of eight percentum per annum upon such unpaid taxes. Provided, however, said tax may be paid in four installments, the first installment of twenty-five percentum on or before the twenty-fourth day of October, A.D. 1969, and the remaining installments as follows: Twenty-five percentum on the twenty-fourth day of December, A.D. 1969; Twenty-five percentum on the twenty-fourth day of February, A.D. 1970; and Twenty-five percentum on the twenty-fourth day of April, A.D. 1970. Each installment of taxes, if paid on or before the last day

of each installment period successively and in order, shall be free from any charge for interest.

If the first installment or any succeeding installment of taxes is not paid by the last date of the respective installment period or periods as they occur, then the whole tax or remaining unpaid balance of the tax, as the case may be, shall immediately become due and payable and shall carry, until collected, a penalty at the rate of eight percentum per annum. The City Collector, shall by advertisement, in the public newspapers of the City, notify all persons assessed to pay their respective taxes at his office on and between the said 1st and twenty-fourth day of October, A.D. 1969, both days inclusive; said Collector shall attend daily during said periods Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays excepted, at his office from nine o'clock A.M. to five o'clock P.M. to receive said taxes.
