RELATING TO SECURITY PERSONNEL FOR
HOUSING FOR THE ELDERLY

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Sections 42-66.1-2, 42-66.1-3 and 42-66.1-9 of the General Laws in Chapter 42-66.1 entitled "Security Personnel for Housing for the Elderly" are hereby amended to read as follows:

42-66.1-2. Definitions. -- As used in this chapter, unless the context requires otherwise:

(1) "Housing for the elderly" and public low income shall mean private and public housing complexes for the elderly located in the cities of Providence, Pawtucket, Central Falls, and Woonsocket and Cranston and in the town of North Providence in the state of Rhode Island.

(2) "Director" shall mean the director of the department of elderly affairs or his designee.

42-66.1-3. Program established. -- (1) In order to ensure the health, safety and welfare of elderly citizens who are residents of public housing for the elderly, and public low income, the director shall establish a

program, to provide security at housing for the low income and elderly complexes.

(2) Participation in the program shall be voluntary. The owner, manager or governing body of a housing for the elderly or low income shall apply to the director to be part of the program, provided, however, no housing for the low income elderly employing adequate security personnel on July 1, 1986 shall be eligible to participate in the program.

42-66.1-9. Appropriation. -- In addition to funds previously appropriated, there is hereby appropriated the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (100,000) to carry out the purpose of this chapter, and the state controller is hereby directed to draw his orders upon the general treasurer for the payment of said sum, or so much thereof as may be required from time to time upon receipt by him of vouchers duly authenticated.

SECTION 2. Section 42-66.1-8 of the General Laws in Chapter 42-66.1 entitled "Security Personnel for Housing For The Low Income Elderly" is hereby repealed in its entirety:

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 1986.

EXPLANATION

PURPOSE: To provide funds for security guards at various public housing facilities, senior citizens housing projects and publicly subsidized units.
