






SUBJECT: Request for 4-way stop sign at the intersection of President Avenue and Taber Avenue.

The office of Traffic Engineering has investigated the request for a 4-way STOP at the intersection of President Avenue and Taber Avenue and has the following to offer:

Existing conditions

- Presently there are double posted STOP signs eastbound and westbound on President Ave.
- There is a 4-way STOP just south of this intersection at Lloyd Ave.
- There is a 4-way STOP two blocks north at Laurel Ave.
- A review of the accident history shows a very limited number of right-angle accidents during the last five years. The right-angle accident history is as follows:

2005	5
2004	3
2003	4
2002	3
2001	1

Based on a review the system warrant requirements, this intersection does not qualify for a four-way stop, according to the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices. The installation of a 4-way STOP at this intersection **is not justified nor warranted**.

As a corrective measure, we will install "No Parking from Here to Corner" signs on Taber Avenue to improve visibility for cars stopping on President Avenue. We have already installed supplemental left hand side STOP signs on each approach of President Ave.

"...signs, if used to excess, tend to lose their effectiveness."
