Resolution in Support of Youth Programs offered by Providence Arts Organizations AS220 and Trinity Repertory Company.

WHEREAS, Afterschool opportunities are important for young people's overall well-being, as well as to school achievement and attendance; and

WHEREAS, Diversity in the range of opportunities and activities available during afterschool hours is necessary in order to meet the needs and interests of young people, and expose students to new areas of learning; and

WHEREAS, These offerings should include creative arts, sports, cultural, and educational opportunities; and

WHEREAS, Arts and music classes and programs in Providence public schools have limited resources due to budget constraints; and

WHEREAS, In Providence, AS220 Youth provides arts educational programming for young people age 14 and older; and

WHEREAS, AS220 Youth was one of only five afterschool programs in the country recognized in 2014 by the Afterschool Alliance for using innovative approaches to help middle school students succeed in the programs, school and life; and

WHEREAS, Trinity Repertory Company in Providence offers a wide spectrum of programming to engage young people in dramatic arts, including acting, musical theater, and playwriting; and

WHEREAS, Both arts organizations contribute valuable programs to give youth the opportunity to have hands-on experience in visual, literary, musical, and theater arts; and

WHEREAS, AS220 was founded thirty years ago, in 1985, and Trinity Repertory Company was founded fifty-two years ago, in 1963, and both organizations have been cornerstones in the arts community in the capital city, helping contribute to the cultural life in Providence in countless ways, and fostering a love for the arts in people of all ages.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the City Council of the City of Providence does hereby encourage and request that the Providence School Board and the Providence School Department, partner with AS220 and Trinity Rep, to incorporate their youth programs into the afterschool offerings available to Providence students, thereby making those programs more accessible and available.

Resolution Regarding the Downtown Baseball Stadium Proposal.

WHEREAS, The new ownership of the Pawtucket Red Sox announced, two months ago, its intention to propose a new baseball stadium in downtown Providence; and

WHEREAS, During the past two months, the new team's owners have hired a public relations firm to organize an extensive and intensive outreach program, including numerous press releases and meetings with State officials and Providence business owners; and

WHEREAS, The team released a proposal on April 15 that included a complete exemption from Providence property taxes for 30 years; and

WHEREAS, The proposed stadium is estimated to be worth more than \$85 million as measured by construction costs and the value of the land; and

WHEREAS, The commercial property taxes the owners are proposing the City to forego exceed \$3 million per year, which over a period of 30 years could underwrite a 30-year, \$45 million mortgage at 5% interest; and

WHEREAS, The current proposal contains several elements that require Providence City Council approval, including but not limited to a tax subsidy, a zoning change and the abandonment of a street (Peck Street); and

WHEREAS, Despite the facts that (1) the proposal includes a \$45 million City investment and other City approvals without which it cannot proceed as planned and (2) the team owners have arranged multiple meetings with multiple officials and stakeholders, the team owners have not as of this time (April 27) found room in their busy schedule to meet with the Providence City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Providence Council hereby cordially invites the owners of the Pawtucket Red Sox to attend an open meeting of the City Council as a whole, to answer the City Council's questions about the baseball stadium proposal.

Resolution Requesting to abate the real estate taxes assessed upon Assessor's Plat 8, Lot 184 (90-92 Pleasant Street).

WHEREAS, Vincent A. Indeglia, Esq., ("the Receiver"), in his capacity as Permanent Receiver for properties located at 90-92 Pleasant Street, Providence, Rhode Island seeks to renovate and complete the sale of the Property at 90-92 Pleasant Street, (herein defined as "the Pleasant Street Property"); and

WHEREAS, The Pleasant Street Property is a three family home, which had previously been abandoned by its record owner and was a public nuisance and danger to the community; and

WHEREAS, The City of Providence filed a complaint in the Superior Court seeking that the Receiver be appointed in order to renovate and rehabilitate the abandoned nuisance conditions of the Property at Pleasant Street; the complaint is identified as *City of Providence v. One Parcel of Real Estate Commonly Known as 90-92 Pleasant Street et al*, C.A. No.: PB2014-1498, pending in the Providence County Superior Court; and

WHEREAS, The Court found as a matter of fact and law that the Property at Pleasant Street was in fact abandoned and deemed a public nuisance according to R.I.G.L. §34-44-1; and

WHEREAS, The Receiver was appointed with authority to renovate the Property and prepare it for possible sale to single families or individuals who will occupy it as their principal residence; and

WHEREAS, The City of Providence is committed to confronting the issue of abandoned property and is committed to mitigating the harmful impact of abandoned and public nuisance properties upon the neighborhoods of and in Providence; and

WHEREAS, The City of Providence has a vested interest in the saleability and marketability of this home post-Receivership; and

WHEREAS, The City of Providence believes that owner occupied residences provide stability to neighborhoods and a sense of community for the individuals residing there; and

WHEREAS, The City of Providence requested the appointment of the Receiver in order to further the above-listed goals; and

WHEREAS, Taxes have been assessed upon the Property at Pleasant Street for several years and said taxes have not been collected due to the abandoned condition of the Property; and

WHEREAS, Said taxes would inhibit the ability of the Receiver to sell the Property post-Receivership to individuals or families seeking residence in the City of Providence in accordance with the goals enumerated above; and

WHEREAS, The Receiver has completed the rehabilitation of the Pleasant Street Property for the purpose of abating the abandonment and public nuisances, and to the extent that, after a public sale, there is or are no remaining proceeds to pay the taxes due and owing after a distribution is made to the Receiver and the Lender, who financed the rehabilitation pursuant to an Order of the Providence Housing Court, the City of Providence requests that such taxes be abated.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the City of Providence that:

1. The findings set forth in a previous proceeding recitals are hereby made and confirmed.
2. Those taxes due and owing on the Property at Pleasant Street are hereby abated and cancelled from the date of assessment up through and including the date of the appointment of the Sale Order authorizing the Permanent Receiver, Vincent A. Indeglia, to convey such Pleasant Street Property to Court approved buyers.


