Section 1. Section 15-2 (a) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 15-2. Penalties for Traffic Violations.

(a) Generally. The general penalties provided for by section 1-10 of this Code of Ordinances, shall apply to violations of this chapter or any regulation made thereunder except that any person electing to appear before the clerk of court, instead of making a personal appearance before the Providence Municipal Court and admitting

the violation charged, shall be punished by a fine as hereinafter respectively set forth:

In the event any of the foregoing stated fines are not paid prior to the 14th day after date of violation, said fines shall be doubled.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon the first to occur (i) the first date of availability of parking tags reflecting the fore-

going fine schedule and (ii) 120 days after date of passage.
