Dear Mr. Vespia:

Resolution of the City Council No. 56, approved January 22, 1965, requesting inspection of vacant lot at 149 West Park Street, to determine whether or not an alleged zoning violation exists, is hereby acknowledged.

Please be advised that on January 22, 1965 an inspection of premises disclosed that there were thirty junked cars, washing machines, an oil range, oil tank, old tires, and all sorts of dismantled automobile parts on said lot.

These lots are located in an M-1 Industrial Zone and are surrounded by other lots in an M-1 Industrial Zone.

This is a permitted use in an M-1 Industrial Zone, provided the lots are enclosed on all sides with a solid wall, or painted board fence not less than four feet high.

Since the lot is not enclosed as required by the Zoning Ordinance, we have notified the owner to remove all junked cars, etc. from the premises within thirty days; otherwise, we shall refer the matter to the City Solicitor for further action.

In talking to the owner personally, I was informed that he has already notified his tenant to vacate the premises.
