WHEREAS, The City of Providence Code of Ordinances contains the official record of legislation for the City of Providence; and

WHEREAS, The quantity of ordinances submitted and approved as city law continues to grow; and

WHEREAS, A number of ordinances have become antiquated and/or obsolete and are in need of consolidation, deletion, redrafting, and/or restructuring; and

WHEREAS, A necessity exists to ensure that all ordinances passed into law are consistent with and not in conflict with the Providence Home Rule Charter, the Constitution of the State of Rhode Island, the Rhode Island General Laws and the Constitution of the United States; and

WHEREAS, The ordinances currently in existence must be reviewed to ensure their appropriateness, consistency, and constitutionality.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, The Providence City Council resolves:

Section 1: That the Council President shall establish a Special Commission to Study the Code of Ordinances to examine the appropriateness, consistency, and constitutionality of the Code of Ordinances.

Section 2: That the Special Commission shall complete its work within a six-month timeframe, to ensure that the Code of Ordinances are consistent with the Providence Home Rule Charter, the Constitution of the State of Rhode Island, the Rhode Island General Laws and the Constitution of the United States.

Section 3: That, upon completion of the Study, the Special Commission shall submit its findings to the Council as a Whole, to be referred to the Council Committee on Ordinances.

Section 4: That the membership of the Special Commission shall include: Three members of the Providence City Council, The City Solicitor or his/her designee; and The Internal Auditor or his/her designee.
