## PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

**COUNCILMAN DeLUCA requests the Privilege of the Floor to Speak on a Point of Personal Privilege and states:**

"I received a letter from the Chairman of the Providence Review Commission informing me that a decision has been reached by the Commission on the concerns I have raised or to the stability of the 1993-1994 City Budget. How, when, or where this decision took place, I don't know. There is no record of a meeting or of a vote on the issue.

The letter however, clearly endorses my contention that this budget is physically unsound.

The Commission admits that this Budget should not have been adopted with such unveri-

fiable revenue assumptions as key components of the Budget and calls on the Council not to adopt future budgets with such uncertainties.

I find the conclusion of the Commission "unsatisfactory" because they failed to recommend a course of action to resolve these budgetary problems.

The Commission was specifically created in 1981 to intervene and initiate a process that would correct this sort of serious expenditure imbalance.

It's like installing a sprinkler system in your building and you then have a fire and the sprinklers just do not work.

Since the Commission has failed in its duty to

initiate a corrective process, I call on the Finance Committee to meet with the Administration and the Providence Review Commission and review the Appropriation Ordinance, so as to reconcile expenditures with real and legal revenue.

Contrary to what you may have heard, the P.R.C. did not conclude that the Budget is "legal". They merely concluded that *it has the appearance of legality*. Appearances, as you all know, can be

deceiving. For example, the ice may appear to be safe (but Beware) before running on it.

If you place a straight stick in a clear pool of water and look down at it, it appears to be Bent. Let's take this budget out of the water and test it for safety and look at it straight.
