

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on this application by the Building Ordinance Board of Review at its meeting held on Wednesday, August 19, 1959,



Potter, 1945 Pulitzer Prize winner whose literary gems up to the time of his demise on August 10, 1959, founded an illustrious career of reporting, editorial writings and in teaching in journalism, and left a living memorial that earned him a niche in the "Hall of Fame" of the Fourth Estate, and

WHEREAS, This newspaperman's Newspaperman whose educational and preparatory background for his newspaper career included an Honorary Degree of Doctor of Literature from his Alma Mater, Brown University where he was graduated in 1921; Honorary membership in the scholastic society of Phi Beta Kappa; an Honorary Master's Degree from Durfee Technical Institute in his native city of Fall River and the Hicks prize for the highest standing in English Literature, and

WHEREAS, His interest in the Irish literary renaissance and of the papers compiled by the late Alfred M. Williams, Editor of the Providence Journal in the 1880's, unfolded a wealth of literary material which formed the foundation of the Alfred M. Williams Memorial established in the Providence Public Library and which was augmented by his pilgrimage to Ireland where he met the affection of the simple country people of rural Ireland of which he wrote of the scenery of that country that compared favorably with any in the whole wide world; the wild rugged Bear Peninsula in the South of Ireland and of Great Blasket Island being the most westerly spot in Ireland; of French Park Ballaghadereen in County Roscommon; of the Barrow River in South Kildare and of County Leix with its malting business and sugar beet factory; of the hill from which one can see
