AN ACT

ALLOWING EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE WHO HAVE SERVED IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR PENSION BENEFITS.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Any member of the Retirement System of the City of Providence who was in the armed service of the United States or in the merchant marine service of the United States, as defined in Chapter 1721 of the Public Laws, 1946, may during any period of one year or more commencing September 16, 1940, pay into the Retirement System a contribution equal to ten (10%) percentum of his compensation earnable in his first year of creditable service, multiplied by the number of years and fraction thereof, in such armed service up to a maximum of four years. Upon such payment, anything to the contrary notwithstanding, such amount shall become part of his accumulated contributions, and the period of service in the armed forces or merchant marine on account of which such payment was made shall be added to his period of service since last becoming a member. The crediting of such service shall be both for the purpose of computing the amount of pension which may become payable under this act, and for the purpose of determining such member's eligibility for the benefits payable hereunder, and the rights of any beneficiary claiming through him.

SEC. 2. This Act shall take effect upon its passage, and all Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
