

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Approved August 14, 1972

WHEREAS, John Edward Meade, former Deputy Director of Public Works and the City Engineer of the City of Providence, has passed away, and

WHEREAS, "Jack" Meade, a distinguished citizen of this City, undertook and successfully pursued several careers, each of which left a milestone in his life academically, politically, militarily, and professionally, and

WHEREAS, a well regarded professional Civil Engineer, Mr. Meade, for close to one-third of a century, was the overseer of construction and maintenance of highway programs in the City of Providence, and

WHEREAS, "Jack" Meade gave his talent and service during World War I and then World War II, in which he earned the rank of Colonel, and

WHEREAS, during his political career, he emerged as a powerful legislator in the House of Representatives of our State,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in noting the demise of John Edward Meade, His Honor, Mayor Joseph A. Doorley, Jr., and the Members of the City Council do hereby pause in respect to his memory, reflecting upon his distinguished careers, and
