J.J., a quite gentle man who usually had a smile on his face, was friend of these guys, and as J.J. had no blood relations, his "family of friends", the men and women of the First Thirty came forward and claimed the body. They raised the money needed to wake him and to buy him. This was their friend and they were not going to let him go to a paupers grave.

In these times of only hearing the bad news that is all around us, I had to make mention of this act of love that was shown to a friend."
