WHEREAS, Mary Evelyn Nerone was born in Providence and attended Classical High School and St. Mary's Academy. She received her RN degree from the St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing and went on to receive her Bachelor of Science in Nursing Education from St. Louis University, and

WHEREAS, During her nursing career, she served as the Pediatric Head Nurse at St. Joseph's Hospital and as an Operating Room Nurse in St. Claire Hospital in New York City. She later served as an instructor in Social Sciences at St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing, and

WHEREAS, Her career as a wife and mother began when she married Dr. William S. Nerone. She raised three boys and six girls, and when necessary, she would help out with her husband's practice. When her husband became disabled, she provided his complete care for eight years prior to his death, and

WHEREAS, While most mothers would say they had enough mothering after nine children, Evelyn "adopted" the entire student bodies of Brown University and Providence College during her career as a student health nurse, and

WHEREAS, Evelyn began her career as an Occupational Health Nurse at Uniroyal and came to Women and Infants in October 1975. Adopting as her motto, "You are never too old to learn", Evelyn has conducted numerous medical education programs including "Rape Crisis Help for Patient and Professionals" and "HIV Counseling and Testing Techniques". She is a certified Sign Language Instructor and has been elected to the Board of Directors of the Rhode Island Association of Occupational Health Nurses, and

WHEREAS, At Women and Infants, Evelyn Nerone has served an entire generation of employees, providing them with a warm welcome at their pre-employment physical, following up with their required physicals and immunizations, and tending to their illnesses in a warm and professional manner which truly inspires other caregivers,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Members of the City Council join the many friends of Evelyn Nerone in congratulating her on what is commonly referred to as "retirement" but in Evelyn's case, will probably be a start of yet another career.

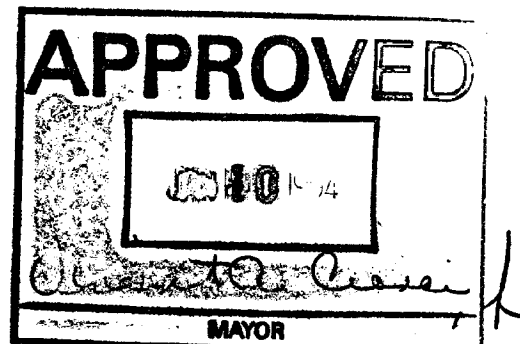
