PROBATE COURT OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE
RHODE ISLAND

February 24, 1971

To The Honorable Joseph A. Doorley, Jr., Mayor and
The Honorable Council of the City of Providence

This report covering the nine month fiscal period from October 1, 1969 to June 30, 1970 reveals that the total receipts during this period was \$44,818.36 which indicates that the receipts for the nine months were substantially the same as the prior fiscal year of twelve months which were \$61,698.81.

The new cases during the past fiscal year were 613. The number of Wills filed for probate were 297, petitions for administration 171, petitions for guardianships 55 and petitions for change of name 54; the balance of the new cases were spread between the other type of cases for which the probate Court is accountable. Because of the shortened fiscal year no real comparison with prior years can be made.

During the past fiscal year there were 11 registry accounts opened and the sum of \$28,081.82 was deposited for the benefit of absentees and unknown heirs and \$3,194.59 has been deposited in accounts for minors.

During the period of the same nine months there were 2,148 documents presented to the Court for action in one way or another most of which required an entry of a decree by the Court. There were 191 annual accounts and 226 final accounts which were filed and allowed and there were 204 affidavits of complete administration filed. In this period 285 wills were admitted to probate and 196 petitions for administration were granted.

All the Will Books from 1646 together with the books containing the original letters of appointment were microfilmed during the year and in addition thereto approximately 3,000 more cases have been microfilmed.




