LINE ITEM VETO BY HIS HONOR, THE MAYOR VINCENT A. CIANCI, JR.

Dear Mr. Clerk:

Pursuant to Sections 302(f) and 412 of the Providence Home Rule Charter of 1980, I do hereby disapprove and veto the following separate items: (1) Section 6, in its entirety, of An Ordinance in Amendment of Chapter 1999-22, Approved August 5, 1999, of the Ordinances of the City of Providence Making an Appropriation of Four Hundred Forty Seven Million, Three Hundred Thirty Five Thousand, Three Hundred Ninety Six Dollars (\$447,335,396) for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2001, as Amended; (2) and Sections 5 and 6, in their entirety, of An Ordinance Establish-

ing a Compensation Plan for the City of Providence and Repealing Ordinance Chapter 1999-23 Approved August 5th, 1999 As Amended.

Generally I support the budget ordinances passed by the City Council, since they contain all of the major provisions that I recommended in the budget I submitted last May. I commend the City Council for your earnest deliberations regarding the city budget. However, I am vetoing the indicated separate items because they impose unnecessary and overly restrictive limitations on the executive authority.

Section 6 of the Compensation Ordinance says, in part that "all employees or officers must be hired at the first step of the annual salary range unless prior approval is obtained from the Providence City Council." This is overly restrictive, because the person being hired may have experience and qualifications that justify a higher salary than the first step. The executive branch, which is responsible for operating city government, should not have its hands tied by the legislative branch.

I am vetoing Section 5 of the Compensation Ordinance because it is substantially the same as Section 4 of the same ordinance.

Section 6 of the Appropriations Ordinance says, in part, that "the funding for any position that becomes vacant during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2001 for any reason shall only be used for offset 'breakage' until such time breakage is zero (0)". Elsewhere, the budget fixes the breakage amount at \$150,000. Once again, the executive branch must be free to fill funded positions — at any time — in order to operate the government effectively.

Given my responsibility as the Chief Executive to manage city government, it is necessary for my administration to meet the demand for personnel should a needed position become vacant during the course of the fiscal year. The imposed restriction in this section might cause unnecessary delay in filling a vital position.

I respect the objective of the City Council to exercise fiscal restraint. I share this objective. Since taking office in January 1991, my administration has achieved budget surpluses in ten straight fiscal years. Between fiscal 1991 and 1999, the tax levy in Providence rose by only 28%, while the levy for all Rhode Island communities rose by 40%. In Warwick, over the same period, the tax levy rose by 37%, and in Cranston it rose by 45%. I can assure the City Council that I will continue to exercise fiscal restraint in 2001.

The budget that the Mayor and City Council have jointly prepared is generally a good spending plan for the city. However, I feel compelled to exercise the veto regarding the specified items in order to ensure the orderly operation of city government.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the City of Providence:

Section 1. To defray the expenses of the City of Providence for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2001, the sums of money or so much thereof, as are authorized by law, indicated in the accompanying schedule, are hereby appropriated for the objects and purposes, and in amounts expressed therein provided that payments thereunder shall be subject to the provisions of the Home Rule Charter of 1980, validated by the General Assembly of the State of Rhode Island at its January Session, A.D., 1981 and approved November 4, 1980, and subject to the provisions of the City Ordinances relative to the expenditures of money from the City Treasury. Fiscal Assistance to State and Local Governments rules and regulations shall govern the portion of this Budget so designated.

Section 2. The payments to the School Fund of the following estimated receipts included in the appropriation of \$234,711,414 for the support of the Public Schools for the City of Providence fiscal period 2000-2001, will be increased or decreased to conform with the actual amounts received from such sources during the City of Providence fiscal year 2000-2001.

Section 3. Any transfer to the General Fund from Expendable Trust Funds shall be restricted to and deemed to be utilized for the reduction of debt obligations of the City of Providence, as provided for in Section 808 of the Home Rule Charter.

Section 4. The provisions included in this ordinance supersede any prior ordinances or any provisions thereof.

Section 5. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 17-185 and Section 17-186 of the Code of Ordinances, the amount of \$20,538,034 is hereby appropriated to the Pension Accumulation Fund.

Section 6. The funding for any position that becomes vacant during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2001 for any reason shall only be used to offset "breakage" until such time breakage is zero (0). The Providence City Council may reapportion this amount by amendment.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

Section 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance, any and all employees in the Office of the Mayor shall be excepted from any salary established herein so long as the total of the compensation for such employees does not exceed the annual budget appropriation for personnel services in the office of the Mayor.

Section 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance, the compensation for positions approved by the Salary Review Board and legal assistants to the City Solicitor shall be no greater than those herein specified; however, any department head or legal assistant to the City Solicitor may be compensated at a rate lower than that established herein, and that lower compensation shall be allowed by this Ordinance.

Section 5. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance, the compensation for positions approved by the Salary Review Board and legal assistants to the City Solicitor shall be no greater than those herein specified; however, any department head or legal assistant to the City Solicitor may be compensated at a rate lower than that established herein, and that lower compensation shall be allowed by this Ordinance. For all positions with salary range provisions, the actual compensation shall be as listed in the personnel supplement.

Section 6. Any person covered by this Ordinance shall not increase compensation by more than one (1) step in any budget year. All employees and officers must be hired at the first step of the annual salary range unless prior approval is obtained from the Providence City Council.

Section 7. The provisions of this ordinance shall not be construed as a ratification of any collective bargaining agreement.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its Passage.

Pursuant to Sections 302 (f) and 412 of the Providence Home Rule Charter of 1980, I do hereby disapprove and veto Sections 5 and 6 of this Ordinance, as indicated in the lined-out areas, and I approve of the balance of the Ordinance.

Section 6 says, in part, that "all employees or officers must be hired at the first step of the annual salary range unless prior approval is obtained from the Providence City Council."

This is overly restrictive, because the person being hired may have experience and qualifications that justify a higher salary than the first step. The Executive Branch, which is responsible for operating city government, should not have its hands tied by the Legislative Branch.

COUNCILMAN ALLEN moves to Override the Veto for Section 6 of the Compensation Ordinance, seconded by **COUNCILWOMAN WILLIAMS**, and is put to vote by the following Roll Call Vote:

The motion to Override the Veto is Denied.
