As per our telephone conversation of February 25th, I would like to submit the following request:

On April 24th the Rhode Island School of Design will again begin its annual student-run "Take-A-Break" entertainment weekend. In the past, your office has graciously provided for the closing of that length of Benefit Street which travels through the RISD campus between Waterman and College Streets. We are again asking for your help and cooperation with this matter.

We have always greatly appreciated your allowing us this privilege and feel that without your efforts our events would have been neither as successful nor gone as greatly appreciated as they have. The closing of Benefit Street serves as an indispensable element of what students maintain as an invaluable break in an otherwise overly intense work schedule.

Again, we appreciate your support and look forward to your reply.

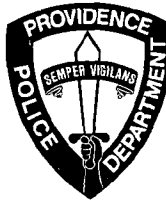
