


Gentlemen:

The Providence Redevelopment Agency, in accordance with the provisions of Paragraph 11 of Chapter 1419 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved August 11, 1961, and Title 45, Chapter 32, Section 5 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, hereby reports concerning the proposed sale of real property within the Central-Classical Project No. R. I. R-2.

The Agency proposes to sell to the New England Butt Company, Division of Wanskuck Company, Site 9A, approximately 24,192 square feet for a total sale price of (\$16,000.00) Sixteen Thousand Dollars. This site will be used by the Redeveloper for the off-street parking of employees. It will replace other land the Redeveloper previously used for this purpose which was condemned by the Agency and which will be devoted to other uses in accordance with the Official Redevelopment Plan for this Project.

The proposed Redeveloper intends to improve the site by constructing a paved parking lot which will provide 80 parking spaces. All required improvements such as paving, wheel guards, drainage, fencing, and shrubbery for screening purposes will, at a minimum, conform to all applicable ordinances and are in accordance with the Official Redevelopment Plan.


Gentlemen:

The Providence Redevelopment Agency in accordance with the provisions of Paragraph 11 of Chapter 1419 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence, approved August 11, 1961, and Title 45, Chapter 32, Section 5 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, hereby reports concerning the proposed sale of real property within the Central-Classical Project No. R. I. R-2.

This Agency proposes to sell to Tremarco Corporation, a subsidiary of the Gulf Corporation, a parcel of land, comprising a total of 227 square feet, for a total sale price of \$450.00. Said parcel of land abuts the adjoining property presently owned by the prospective purchaser.

The site to be sold to Tremarco Corporation was formerly owned by them, and was condemned for the widening of Bridgham Street. The Traffic Engineering Department made changes to the traffic plan to allow ingress and egress routes to the gas station which is remaining. As a result of these changes, this small strip of land remains, and since the strip of land has no value to anyone else, the Agency offered it to the former owner, who has expressed a desire to purchase it.
