



RE: Resignation from Providence School Board

Dear Mayor Cianci:

Please except my resignation from the Providence School Board, effective January 10, 1994. As you know I was originally appointed by you in 1978 and served until 1983. I was re-appointed in 1987. I have now served a total of 12 years. Five different superintendents served during this period. I have had the distinct pleasure of serving with about 25 different school board members, including our Governor. I consider myself fortunate to have worked with so many dedicated individuals.


During the 12 years that I served I dedicated myself to improving our school system for all our children. Our school population underwent an unprecedented demographic change. Financial resources became ever so scarce. The perenial challenge to the school board was to do more with less. I am proud to have been involved in improving our system. Some of the most significant improvements that I, as a school board member successfully advocated for include: increasing minority personnel and staff; decreasing the dropout rate; improving standardized test scores; getting closer to full compliance with special education requirements; developing a modern desegregation plan; improving and expanding our physical plants to accommodate our expanding population; negotiating labor contracts that are not only fair to our tax payers but also allow for further improvements of our school system, and; implementing the Probe recommendations.

Perhaps our greatest accomplishment is that our school system is now on the right track. However, we must not get complacent. We still have our work cut out for us. I sincerely believe that there is no reason why Providence cannot have the very best urban school school system in the entire nation within a few years.

I am most grateful to you for giving me the opportunity to serve on the School Board. Now, I look forward to channeling my energies to the Providence Housing Court.

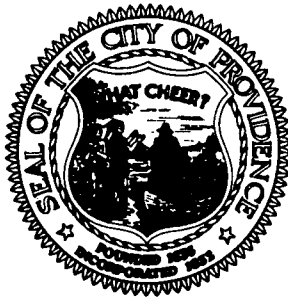
