

# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 320

Approved August 14, 1972

WHEREAS, a Connecticut study Commission has invited Rhode Island to share in its plans for a 75,000 acre transportation complex centered on a jet port which would have as many as 20 passenger terminals, and

WHEREAS, this plan will have the same impact on our area as a sea-port had in the days of clipper ships, and a new railroad line had on the communities in the early growth of America, and

WHEREAS, the most important economic need of the area is the attraction of new industry, and

WHEREAS, the proposal provides for a 30,000 acre industrial city and a 45,000 acre green belt which could produce as many as 38,000 new jobs by the 1980's and

WHEREAS, it is unlikely any other feasible site exists which would be closer to our City, and

WHEREAS, just as in our water resources and green-acres programs, time is short before this relatively undeveloped area gets built up and overpriced.

WHEREAS, such a jet port will encourage the location of industry and offices in the Greater Providence area, as well as jobs for our citizens, especially in business involved in international trade.


