

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 13

Approved January 10, 1972

WHEREAS, the late Irving Jay Fain of Providence, Rhode Island, on February 28, 1967 purchased certain land located at 389 Morris Avenue, Tax Assessor's Plat No. 7, Lot 120; and

WHEREAS Irving Jay Fain did convey the said parcel to the Irving Jay and E. Macie Fain Fund, a tax exempt trust, in the year 1968; and

WHEREAS the Trustees of the Irving Jay and E. Macie Fain Fund, namely Irving Jay Fain and E. Macie Fain, desired to develop this unproductive and filth-strewn land into a Mini-Park for the educational and recreational use of young children; and

WHEREAS the development of the Mini-Park changed the use of the land from nonproductivity with offensive conditions to a recreational use for young children contributing to the welfare of the neighborhood, the enhancement of property values, and the educational and beneficial enjoyment of youngsters; and

WHEREAS during his lifetime Irving Jay Fain expressed the wish, orally and in writing, to donate to the City of Providence the aforestated Mini-Park at 389 Morris Avenue, for the use of the City of Providence; and

WHEREAS it is the desire and decision of the Trustees of the Irving Jay and E. Macie Fain Fund to convey the Mini-Park at 389 Morris Avenue, to the City of Providence without cost to the City; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the City of Providence hereby accepts deed in fee simple to the land and buildings hereinafter described from the owners thereof:

That certain lot or parcel of land with the buildings and improvements thereon located on the easterly side of Morris Avenue in the City and County of Providence, laid out and designated as Lot No. 15 on that plat entitled, "Pembroke Villa Providence, R. I. February 1911, C.A. Thayer, Engr.", which plat is recorded in Providence Land Evidence Records in Plat Book 31 at page 49 and (copy) on Plat Card 982.

Said lot bounds westerly on Morris Avenue forty (40) feet and holding that width extends easterly one hundred (100) feet, bounding northerly on land now or lately of Thomas E. Greene, et al, southerly on land now or lately of Iser Widawski et al, and easterly partly on land now or lately of Albert Silver et ux and partly on other land now or lately of Irving Jay Fain.

The consideration for this deed is such that no documentary stamps are required, said parcel being hereby conveyed to the City of Providence by Deed of Gift.





Dear Sirs:

Please be advised that building located at 37 Putnam Street (rear house), was re-inspected on December 28, 1971 and building was found to be secure but there were three broken windows.

The owner was notified on October 13, 1971 to replace broken windows.

We have been in contact with Attorney Norman D'Andrea, who is handling the estate, and he has indicated because of economic circumstances it is almost impossible for them to repair the building at this time. The attorney further indicated that he would like a little more time to work out some possible solution before they abandon the property and have the city demolish it.

Since the building is not in a dangerous condition, we have given the attorney another week or so to find some some solution to this problem.


Dear Councilman Addison:
