# RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 54

*Approved* February 2, 1989

RESOLVED, That His Honor the Mayor be and he hereby is authorized to execute an agreement with the Department of Environmental Management, State of Rhode Island, to permit the City's participation in the Waste Oil Collection Program, a copy of said agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit A. Said Program has been formed to provide the citizens of the City of Providence a receptacle within which waste oil may be deposited.

Under such program, the State will provide the City a suitable container, a fund of up to Seven Hundred (\$700) Dollars per site for the installation of a bermed pad to retain spillage, and removal of the waste oil for one (1) year period. Thereafter, the City is responsible for the continuation of the Program. Each party may terminate its participation at will.

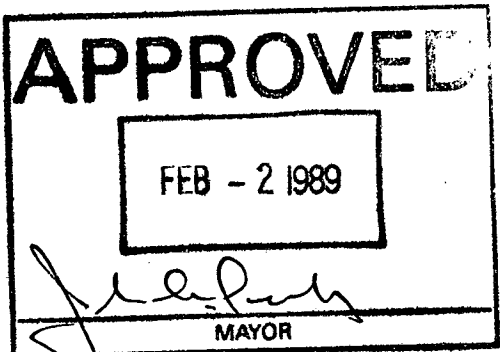
