

Reference Resolution No. 138, March 11, 1985, requesting the replacement of traffic signals at the intersection of Brook Street and Wickenden Street.

Be advised that we have scheduled the replacement of the traffic signals by August 5, 1985. Hopefully, the lights will be replaced sooner pending delivery of some parts on order. By law, to reacquaint motorists with new lights, we are required to operate the traffic signals in a flashing mode prior to operating them on red-and-green normal operation.

Illegal parking at this intersection is plentiful. It is the cause of numerous accidents and traffic congestion as it restricts the driver's sight distance/vision and turning radius. These parking prohibitions also serve the local fire company by providing clearance width at the intersection for turning their apparatus. Illegally parked vehicles should be tagged since they endanger public safety.
