The Committee on Education has the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of January 27, 1969, regarding the proposed legislation, H.R. 1080, which would amend the National Education Goals Act of 1965. The Committee has carefully considered the matter and has concluded that the proposed legislation is not in the best interests of the Nation and, therefore, it does not recommend its passage.

The Committee believes that the existing law, the National Education Goals Act of 1965, provides a sound framework for the development and implementation of national education goals. The Act establishes a process for the periodic review and revision of these goals, and it provides for the establishment of a National Education Goals Commission to carry out this process. The Committee believes that this process is essential for the development of a coherent and effective national education policy.

The proposed legislation, H.R. 1080, would amend the Act in a number of ways that the Committee believes would be detrimental to the development of a coherent and effective national education policy. In particular, the proposed legislation would eliminate the National Education Goals Commission and would transfer its functions to the Department of Education. The Committee believes that this transfer would result in a loss of the independence and objectivity that the Commission has provided in its previous work.

The Committee also believes that the proposed legislation would result in a loss of the public participation that has been an important part of the development of national education goals. The Commission has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from educators, parents, and the general public. The Committee believes that this public participation is essential for the development of goals that are truly representative of the needs of the Nation.

For the above reasons, the Committee does not recommend the passage of H.R. 1080. It urges the House of Representatives to reject the bill.

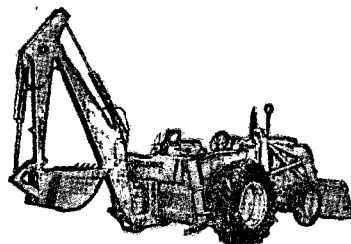

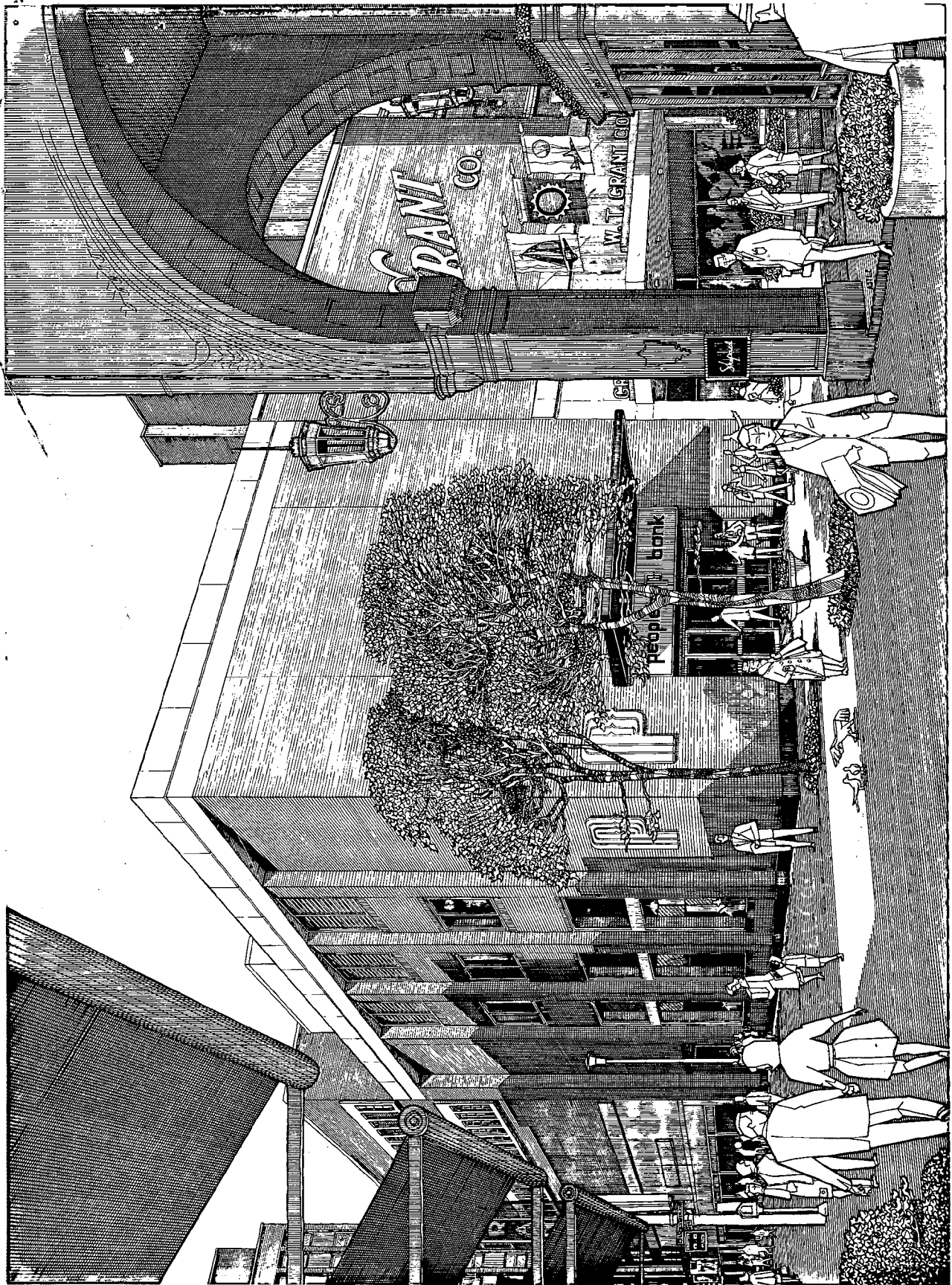

The subject referral received consideration by the City Plan Commission at a meeting held on Tuesday, October 8, 1968.


This petition is a request for permission to erect a canopy on a building now under construction along Westminster Mall. The canopy will be constructed of reinforced concrete and will extend eight feet beyond the northerly property line of the Owner's property, and will extend in the east and west direction along Westminster Street a distance of 19 feet 7 inches, at the approximate center of the Owner's property.

The canopy will obtain its support by cantilever action from the steel frame of the building. Securely attached to the bottom surface of the canopy will be three metal light fixtures.

VOTED: To offer no objection provided the Council has the authority under the Sign Ordinance to allow it, and provided that no signs are incorporated in the design.

Re: Proposed Canopy for Peoples Savings Bank


Pursuant to your inquiry of October 11, 1968, I have examined the sketch of the proposed canopy.

Ordinance No. 1736 prohibits the erection of projecting signs. "Projecting sign" does not encompass a canopy or marquee.

The ordinance does not prohibit the erection of a sign. "Sign" does include a marquee or canopy.

Accordingly, it is my opinion that the erection of the proposed canopy or marquee would not be in violation of the above cited ordinance.
