Dear Honorable Members of the City Council:

Pursuant to Sections 302(f) and 412 of the Providence Home Rule Charter, I hereby disapprove and veto the Resolution passed March 30, 1999 by the City Council of the City of Providence relative to "requesting the Director of Public Property to make necessary preparations to facilitate and secure the Board of Aldermen's Chamber to be used as the public meeting room for the various committees of the City Council".

Currently, City Council meetings are held in Committee Room A, the Council Chamber and the conference room on the third floor of City Hall. The Aldermen's Chamber has been utilized for swearing in ceremonies, receptions, award ceremonies, graduations, art exhibitions and holiday celebrations open to the benefit of the public on a regular basis. Also, this is the only remaining room in City Hall that is large enough to service the many meetings of City departments, services for the employees and the public-at-large, such as the wellness programs and flu shot clinics. To secure yet another room in City Hall for council meetings would unnecessarily eliminate the use of the chamber for those events, especially in light of the space already available for council purposes.

Additionally, Council Committee meetings are held primarily in the evening, which means the Chamber would be underutilized, yet unavailable, during City Hall business hours.
