CHAPTER 1005

No. 45 **AN ORDINANCE** AMENDING SECTION 197 of CHAPTER
2 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE, 1946,
RELATIVE TO CERTAIN TRAFFIC FINES, AND ADDING SECTIONS 198 AND 199.

Approved January 28, 1956

Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1. Section 197 of Chapter 2 of the Revised Ordinances of
the City of Providence relating to the Traffic Engineering Department is
hereby amended to read as follows:

"The general penalties provided for by Section 10, Chapter 1, Re-
vised Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1946, shall apply to
violation of this article or any regulations made thereunder ex-
cept that any person convicted of any of the following offenses
shall be punished by a fine not less than as hereinafter respect-
ively set forth.

OFFENSE

Overtime Parking -----	\$1.00
(Provided that for a second such offense within any 12-month period next following the first conviction, the fine shall be \$2; and the fine \$3 for a third such offense, within the 12-month period next following the first conviction.)	
Parking in Prohibited Area (No Parking) -----	\$3.00
Parking within 8 feet of a Fire Hydrant -----	3.00
Parking in a Loading Zone -----	3.00
Parking in a Taxi Stand -----	3.00
Parking within 25 feet of a Corner -----	3.00
Parking to Obstruct a Driveway -----	3.00
Parking on a Sidewalk -----	3.00
Standing in Prohibited Areas -----	3.00
Double Parking -----	3.00
(Provided that for a second offense of "Double Parking" or "Standing in Prohibited Areas" within any 12-month period next following the first con- viction, the fine shall be \$4; and the fine \$5 for a third such offense, within the 12-month period next following the first conviction.)	
✓ Parking in a marked Bus Stop -----	3.00
Parking in excess of 1 foot, but not more than 3 feet from curb -----	3.00
Parking with Left Wheels to Curb -----	3.00
Angle Parking -----	3.00
Parking on Marked Crosswalk or within Intersection ----	3.00
Stopping Bus away from Curb -----	3.00

SEC. 2. Sections 198 and 199 are hereby added to said Chapter 2, and to read as follows:

"Sec. 198. A person charged with the violation of any traffic regulation and notified in writing by a police officer to appear to answer such charge before the Police Court, instead of personally appearing in court, may in person or by one duly authorized by him in writing, appear before the Clerk of said court, admit the truth of said charge, and pay to said Clerk the designated fine: provided that such appearance, admission and payment be made at the office of said Clerk during regular business office hours, within five (5) days of such notification, and failure to so appear shall be deemed a waiver of the right to dispose of such charge without personal appearance in court. The right to dispose of such a charge without personal appearance in court may not be exercised by any person who in any consecutive period of 12 months next preceding such charge has been three times in the aggregate adjudged guilty by the Police Court of any violation of traffic regulation or ordinances, or has admitted the truth of charges made against him relating to traffic offenses.

"The payment of the fine to the Clerk as herein provided shall operate as a final disposition of the charge, and such proceedings shall not be deemed criminal. Notice of any violation shall indicate the offense charged, and shall also contain such other information as will enable the person charged to take advantage of the provisions of this section."

"Sec. 199. Any police officer may remove and impound, or cause to be removed or impounded, any vehicle parked upon any street or highway, in such a violation of any parking regulation, other than overtime parking, as to constitute an obstruction to traffic. A towing charge not exceeding five (\$5) dollars, plus a storage charge not exceeding one (\$1) dollar for each day or fraction thereof thereafter, shall be paid to the Clerk of the Police Court or some official designated by him before any such vehicle shall be released. The payment of such charges shall not release operator from any penalty imposed for violation of a traffic regulation."

SEC. 3. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, and all ordinances or parts thereof inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
