Be it ordained by the City of Providence:

SECTION 1: Chapter 666 of the Ordinances of the City of Providence as approved September 22, 1952, and entitled: "An Ordinance Making Appropriation of \$28,328,060.70 for the Support of the City Government for the Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 1953", as amended, is hereby further amended by adding the sum of Thirty Five Hundred (\$3500) Dollars to the appropriation contained therein for INTEREST ON BONDED DEBT.

SECTION 2: The said sum of Thirty Five Hundred (\$3500) Dollars as thus added and appropriated shall be obtained by authorizing and directing the City Controller and the City Treasurer to transfer a like amount from the Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures Account to the Receipt Account.

SECTION 3: The Estimated Receipts from Reserve for Extraordinary Expenditures is hereby increased by Thirty Five Hundred (\$3500) Dollars.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

AN ACT

IN AMENDMENT OF SECTION 41 OF CHAPTER 608 OF THE GENERAL LAWS, 1938,
ENTITLED "OFFENSES AGAINST PRIVATE PROPERTY."

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 41 of Chapter 608 of the General Laws, 1938,
entitled "Offenses Against Private Property", is hereby amended to
read as follows:

"§41. A person who wilfully or maliciously displaces, removes, injures or destroys a mile-board, mile-stone, danger-sign or signal, or guide-sign or post, or any inscription thereon, lawfully within a public highway; or who, in any manner paints, prints, places, puts or affixes, or causes to be painted, printed, placed or affixed, any business or commercial advertisement on or to any stone, tree, fence, stump, pole, building or other object, which is the property of another, without first obtaining the written consent of such owner thereof, or who in any manner paints, prints, places, puts or affixes, or causes to be painted, placed or affixed, such an advertisement on or to any stone, tree, fence, stump, pole, mile-board, mile-stone, danger-sign, danger-signal, guide-sign, guide-post, bill-board, building or other object within the limits of a public highway, without first obtaining the written consent of the chief of police of the city or town in which said highway is located, is punishable by a fine of not less than \$5.00, nor more than \$25.00, or by imprisonment for not more than 10 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Any advertisement in or upon a public highway in violation of the provisions of this chapter may be taken down, removed or destroyed by anyone."

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage, and all acts or parts of acts inconsistent therewith are hereby repealed.

ORDERED, That the Superintendent of Street Signs and Numbers be and he is hereby directed to cause a sign to be placed at Hurley Avenue and Clarendon Avenue abandoned as aforesaid having thereon the words, "Not a Public Highway", and it is further

ORDERED, That after the entry of this order or decree the City Clerk shall cause a notice thereof to be published in a newspaper, published in the County of Providence, at least once each week for three successive weeks and a further and personal notice shall be served by the City Sergeant upon each and every owner abutting upon said Hurley Avenue and Clarendon Avenue which have been abandoned, who is known to reside within this State.

Gentlemen:

The subject referral received consideration by the City Plan Commission at a meeting held on Tuesday, November 25, 1952.

This referral is a request by the Alton Realty Company for the abandonment of Hurley Avenue from Clarendon Avenue to Sessions Street and the westerly portion of Clarendon Avenue from Cole Avenue to its westerly termination.

These streets or portions thereof are "paper streets" which do not exist on the ground.


To the east of Hurley Avenue is the East Side Outdoor Skating Rink and to the west lies vacant land.

To the north of the portion of Clarendon Avenue in question is the Skating Rink, and to the south lies Hope Alumni Field.

VOTED: To offer no objection to the abandonment by the city of such highway rights as it may have in the extension of Clarendon Avenue westerly from Cole Avenue to its westerly termination, and the abandonment of Hurley Avenue to Sessions Street southerly.

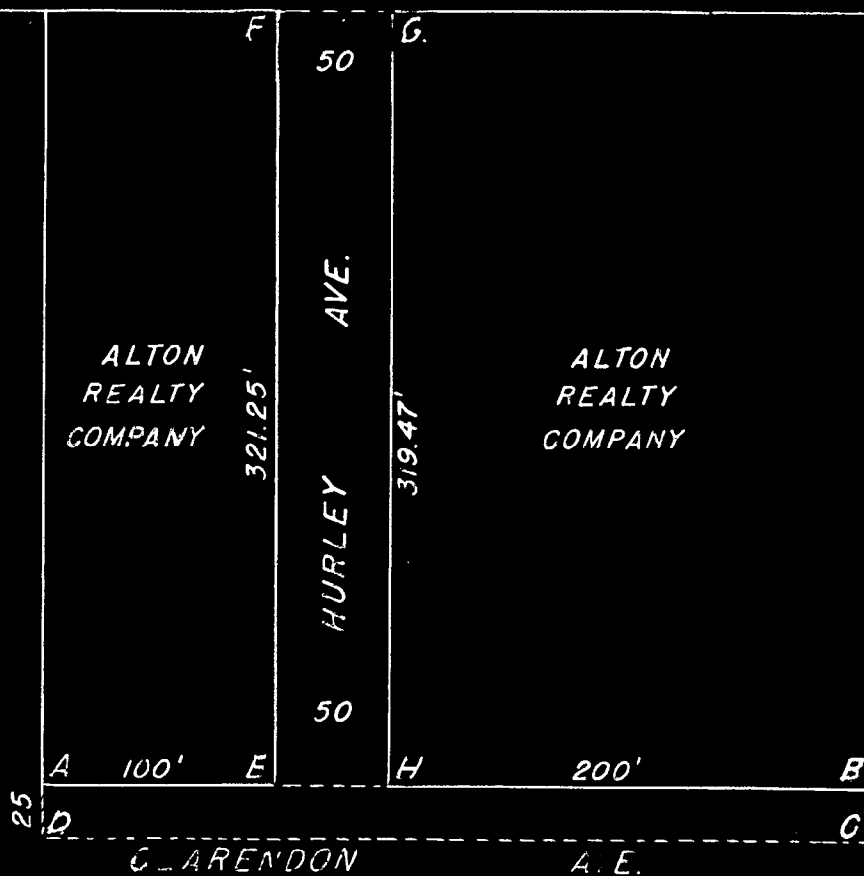
