RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

Approved

October 24, 1985

WHEREAS, Narragansett Electric Company is considering the request for a rate increase to cover the expense incurred during the recent hurricane, and

WHEREAS, They were ordered to deposit \$400,000 a year in 1982 to pay for emergency purposes, such as that which occurred as a result of Hurricane Gloria, and

WHEREAS, They had ample warning of the impending storm and, according to reports, 52% of the customers were without power,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Members of the City Council hereby urge the Public Utilities Commission not to grant any increase that may be requested by the Narragansett Electric Company, and

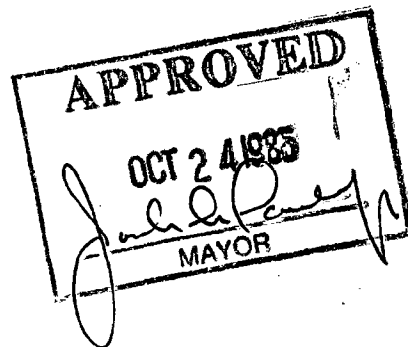
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Public Utilities Commission, in concert with the Governor and Attorney General of the State of Rhode Island launch an immediate investigation as to why said utility company was so ill prepared to handle the emergency created by Hurricane Gloria.

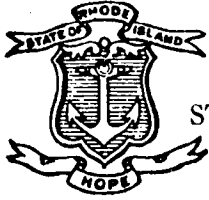
