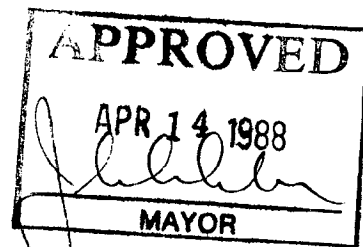
RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Providence requests that the General Assembly enact legislation relating to narcotic nuisances the purpose of which is to penalize any person maintaining a narcotic nuisance by imposing fines of \$500 or two years in prison for the first offense and \$2,000 and five years in prison for the second offense and ten years in prison for any subsequent offense. It further penalizes a landlord \$1,000 for knowingly allowing a narcotic nuisance to be maintained in their building.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

SECTION 1. 21-28-5 of the General Laws in Chapter 21-28 entitled "Uniform Controlled Substances Act" is amended by adding the following:

21-28-5.08 Places used by addicts or for unlawful sale of narcotics. - Any store, shop, warehouse, building, vehicle, aircraft, steamboat, or vessel, or any place whatever which is resorted to by habitual users of narcotic drugs for the purpose of using or taking such narcotic drugs in any manner, or which are used for the illegal keeping or sale of the said narcotic drugs shall be deemed a common nuisance. Whoever keeps or maintains such a common nuisance shall upon conviction be punished for the first offense by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500) or imprisonment for not more than two (2) years, and for the second offense by a fine of not more than two thousand dollars (\$2,000) or by imprisonment for not more than five (5) years, or both such fine and imprisonment; and for any subsequent offense by imprisonment for not more than ten (10) years.

21-28-5.09 Landlord letting or failing to abate nuisance.- Every person who shall let any building or tenement owned by him or under his control, for any of the purposes enumerated in 21-28.5.08 or who shall knowingly permit any such building

or tenement, or part thereof, to be so used while under his control, or who shall, after five (5) days notice from any officer or magistrate of any such use of said building or tenement, omit to take all reasonable measures to eject the tenant or occupant from said premises as soon as the same may lawfully be done, shall be deemed and taken to be guilty of aiding in the maintenance of such nuisance, and shall be fined not less than one hundred dollars (\$100) nor more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or be imprisoned in the adult correctional institutions not less than sixty (60) days nor more than one (1) year.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

EXPLANATION  
OF  
A N A C T  
RELATING TO NARCOTIC NUISANCES

This act requires penalties of five hundred (\$500) dollars or up to two (2) years in jail, for a first offense, and one thousand (\$1000) dollars and up to five (5) years in jail for subsequent offenses, for maintaining a narcotic nuisance. It also requires penalties of up to one thousand (\$1000) dollars or up to one year in jail for any landlord that knowingly permits an occupant of their building to maintain a narcotic nuisance.

This act would take effect upon passage.
