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## ORDINANCES SECOND READING

The following Ordinances were in City Council July 6, 2000, Read and Passed the First Time and are severally returned for Passage the Second Time:

An Ordinance in amendment of and in addition to Article X "Shows and Other Amusements" of the City Code of Ordinances, as amended.

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

Section 1. That Article X of the Code of Ordinances be amended by adding a new Division 4, Section 14-230 as follows:

*Division 4. Commercial establishments where alcoholic beverages are offered for sale*

*Sec. 14-230. Nudity on premises where alcoholic beverages are offered for sale.*

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person maintaining, owning, or operating any commercial eating and/or drinking establishment, whether or not entertainment is provided, and at which alcoholic beverages are offered for sale for consumption on the premises to suffer or permit:

(1) Any female person, while on the premises of the commercial establishment, to expose to the public view that area of the human breast at or below the areola thereof.

(2) Any female person, while on the premises of the commercial establishment, to employ any device or covering which is intended to give the appearance of or simulate

such portions of the human female breast as described in subsection (a)(1) above.

(3) Any person, while on the premises of the commercial establishment, to expose to public view his or her genitals, pubic area, anus or anal cleft.

(4) Any person while on the premises of the commercial establishment, to employ any device or covering which is intended to give the appearance of or simulate the genitals, pubic area, buttocks, anus or anal cleft.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any female person, while on the premises of any commercial eating and/or drinking establishment, whether or not entertainment is provided, and at which alcoholic beverages are offered for sale for consumption on the premises, to expose to the public view that area of the human female breast at or below the areola thereof, or to employ any device or covering which is intended to give the appearance of or simulate such areas of the female breast as described herein.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any person, while on the premises of any commercial eating/drinking establishment, whether or not entertainment is provided, at which alcoholic beverages are offered for sale for consumption on the premises, to expose to public view his or her genitals, pubic area, anus or anal cleft

or buttocks, or to employ any device or covering which is intended to give the appearance or simulate the genitals, pubic area, buttocks, anus or anal cleft.

(d) Any person who shall violate any provision of this section shall be guilty of an offense against the City punishable as provided in Sec. 1-10 of this Code, and by a fine of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each offense or by imprisonment of not less than thirty (30) days. The provisions of this section shall be enforced by the Providence Police Department.

(e) Any "Adult Entertainment" establishment, as provided for and defined in the Providence Zoning Ordinance, as amended, which was lawfully existing prior to the passage of this section, is exempt from the provisions of this section.

*Section 2.* This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage.

An Ordinance amending Section 1 Chapter 7 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Providence, entitled "Civil Defense", as amended.

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

**Chapter 7. Civil Defense Emergency Management**

\* Charter reference(s) — Powers of City § 2.1. et. seq.

State law reference(s) — Scope of ordinances which may be enacted, § 45-66-1, Gen. Laws 1956.

**Sec. 7-1. Civilian Defense Emergency Management Council — Creation and composition.**

Sec. 7-1. ~~Civilian Defense Emergency Management Council~~ — Creation and composition.

There shall be a Providence ~~civilian defense Emergency Management Council~~ which shall consist of the following:

(a) The mayor of the city, who shall serve as chairman of the council.

(b) A director of ~~civilian defense emergency management~~ to be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the mayor of the city. The director shall be charged with the preparation of the ~~civilian defense emergency management~~ plan for the city, together with such other duties as the mayor may prescribe. He shall also serve as vice-chairman of the council.

(c) An assistant director of ~~civilian defense emergency management~~ appointed by and holding office at the pleasure of the director, subject to approval of the mayor, who shall exercise such duties as the director may prescribe.

(d) The deputy directors of divisions and the chiefs of services of such divisions as may be provided for by ordinance of the city council, said deputy director to be appointed by the director of ~~civilian defense emergency management~~, with approval of the mayor.

(e) Representatives not to exceed twenty-five (25) in number from civic, business, industry, labor, veterans, professional or other groups, to be selected and appointed by the mayor.

Sec. 7-2. Same — Meetings.

The Providence ~~civilian defense Emergency Management Council~~ shall meet upon the call of either the chairman or the vice-chairman.

(Ch. 8A, § 2, added by Ord. 1952, ch. 583 § 2)

Sec. 7-3. Same — General powers and duties.

The powers and duties of the Providence ~~civilian defense Emergency Management Council~~ shall include the recommendation for adoption by the city council of a ~~civilian defense Emergency Management Plan~~ for the city and the recommendation for adoption by the city council of any and all mutual aid plans and agreements which are deemed essential for the implementation of such ~~civilian defense Emergency Management Plan~~. The duties of

such civilian defense Emergency Management Council shall also include a continuing study of the need for amendments and improvements in the civilian defense Emergency Management Plan adopted by the city council.

Sec. 7-4. Powers and duties of director of civilian defense emergency management.

(a) There shall be a director of civilian defense emergency management, who shall have the authority to request the declaration of the existence of an emergency by the city council or by higher authority. In the event that it is deemed necessary to declare the existence of an emergency without delay if the city council is not in session, the mayor, upon his own initiative or upon request of the director, may do so, but such action shall be subject to confirmation by the city council at its next meeting.

(b) The duties and responsibilities of the director of civilian defense emergency management shall include the following:

(1) The control and direction of the actual or training efforts of the civilian defense emergency management organization of the city;

(2) The determination of all questions of authority and responsibility that may arise within the civilian defense emergency management organization of the city;

(3) The maintenance of necessary liaison with other municipal, area, state, regional,

federal or other civilian defense emergency management organizations;

(4) The marshaling, after the declaration of an emergency as provided above, of all necessary personnel, equipment or supplies from any department of the city to aid in the carrying out of the civilian defense Emergency Management Plan;

(5) The issuance of all necessary proclamations as to the existence of an emergency and the immediate operational effectiveness of the civilian defense Emergency Management Plan;

(6) The issuance of reasonable rules and regulations which are necessary for the protection of life and property in the city, including but not limited to rules and regulations applicable to blackouts and air raids;

(7) The supervision of the drafting and execution of mutual aid agreements entered into by the city;

(8) The supervision of and final authorization for the procurement of all necessary supplies and equipment, including acceptance of private contributions; and

(9) The authorizing of agreements, after approval of the city solicitor, for the use of private property for air raid shelter and other purposes.

(c) The powers and duties referred to in paragraphs (4), (5), (6) and (8) of subsection (b) shall be exercisable only with the prior approval of the mayor.

Sec. 7-5. Operational ~~civilian~~ defense **emergency management** organization.

(a) The operational ~~civilian~~ defense **emergency management** organization of the city shall consist of the officers and employees of the city designated by the director of ~~civilian~~ defense **emergency management** as well as all volunteer municipal defense workers.

(b) The functions and duties of this organization shall be distributed among such divisions, services and special staff as the city council shall prescribe by ordinance. Any such ordinance shall set forth the forms of organization, establish and designate divisions and services, assign functions, duties and powers, and designate officers and employees to carry out the provisions of this chapter. Insofar as possible, the form of organization, title and terminology shall conform to the recommendations of the federal government and the recommendations of the ~~civilian~~ defense **Emergency Management** Agency of the State of Rhode Island.

Sec. 7-6. Oath of members of ~~civilian~~ defense **Emergency Management** Council and operational organization.

Each person serving as a member of the ~~civilian~~ defense **Emergency Management** Council, or as an officer, employee or volunteer in any capacity in the ~~civilian~~ defense **emergency management** organization created by ordinance pursuant to the authority herein conferred, shall, prior to assuming their

duty or duties, take an oath which shall be substantially as follows:

"I \_\_\_\_\_, do solemnly swear (or affirm), that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Rhode Island, against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties upon which I am about to enter. And I do further swear (or affirm) that I do not advocate, nor am I a member or an affiliate of any political party or organization, group or combination of persons that advocates the overthrow of the Government of the United States of America or of this State by force or violence; and that during such time as I am a member of the ~~Civilian~~ Defense **emergency management** organization of the City of Providence I will not advocate nor become a member or an affiliate of any organization, group or combination of persons or of any political party that advocates the overthrow of the Government of the United States or of this State by force or violence."

Sec. 7-7. Shelter managers — Designation as part of ~~civilian~~ defense **emergency management** organization.

Shelter managers who possess a certificate of proper training from the ~~civilian~~ defense **Emergency Management** Council shall be considered as a special staff forming part of the operational ~~civilian~~ defense **emergency management** organization of the city.

Sec. 7-8. Same — Powers and duties.

Shelter managers shall be assigned to specific shelter areas by the ~~civilian~~ defense Emergency Management Council, and shall be in complete charge of such specified shelter areas subject to orders of the ~~civilian~~ defense Emergency Management Council or the director and/or deputy director of ~~civilian~~ defense emergency management when communication is possible. In the absence of such communication, the shelter manager of an assigned shelter area shall possess all the powers and duties of the ~~civilian~~ defense emergency management director as stated in section 7-4. Shelter managers who find themselves in a shelter not specifically assigned to them shall act as deputy shelter managers to the assigned shelter manager. In the absence of the assigned shelter manager, any shelter manager present shall assume the duties of the assigned shelter manager.

Sec. 7-9. Same — Commencement of duties.

The duties of the special staff or shelter managers shall begin upon the declaration of an emergency as stated in section 7-4, and shall continue so long as the declaration of the emergency is in force.

(Ord. 1963, ch. 1536 § 2)

Sec. 7-10. Orders, rules and regulations pursuant to chapter to supersede existing provisions.

At all times during the existence of an actual emergency when the orders, rules and regulations made and promulgated pursuant to this chapter shall be in effect, they shall

supersede all existing ordinances, orders, rules and regulations insofar as the latter may be inconsistent therewith, unless the city council shall otherwise determine.

Sec. 7-11. Construction of chapter.

This chapter shall not be so construed as to conflict with any state or federal statute or with any military or naval order, rule or regulation.

Sec. 7-12. Liability for death, injury, damage, from ~~civilian~~ defense emergency management activities.

(a) This chapter shall be construed as an exercise by the city of its governmental functions for the protection of the public peace, health and safety, and neither the city, the agents and representatives of said city, nor any individual, receiver, firm, partnership, corporation, association, or trustee, or any of the agents thereof, in good faith carrying out, complying with or attempting to comply with, any order, rule or regulation promulgated pursuant to the provisions of this chapter shall be liable for damage sustained to persons or property as the result of said activity.

(b) Any person owning or controlling real estate or other premises who voluntarily and without compensation grants to the city a license or privilege, or otherwise permits the city to inspect, designate and use the whole or any part or parts of such real estate or premises for the purpose of sheltering persons during an actual, impending or practice enemy attack,

together with his successors in interest, if any, shall not be civilly liable for the death of, or injury to, any person on or about such real estate or premises under such license, privilege or other permission or for loss of, or damage to, the property of such person.

Sec. 7-13. Obstructing members of organization; violation of rules and regulations; unlawful wearing of insignia.

It shall be unlawful for any person wilfully to obstruct, hinder or delay any member of the **civilian defense emergency management** organization in the enforcement of any rule or regulation issued pursuant to this chapter, or to do any act forbidden by any rule or regulation issued pursuant to the authority contained in this chapter. It shall likewise be unlawful for any person to wear, carry, or display any emblem, insignia, or any other means of identification as a member of the **civilian defense emergency management** organization of the city unless authority so to do has been granted to such person by the proper officials.

Sec. 7-14. Display of lights in violation of order or regulation.

Any light displayed contrary to any order, rule or regulation promulgated pursuant to the provisions of this chapter shall constitute a public nuisance and when deemed necessary in order to protect life or property during blackouts or air raids, the police shall be authorized and directed to enter upon any premises within the

city, using reasonable force, and extinguish lights or take other necessary action to make effective any order, rule or regulations promulgated under the authority conferred by this chapter.

Sec. 7-15. Unauthorized operation of blackout or air raid signal.

It shall be unlawful for any unauthorized person to operate a siren or other device so as to simulate a blackout signal or air raid, or the termination of a blackout or air raid.

Sec. 7-16. Advance warning to public of impending major storm.

Whenever an impending major storm is predicted that may effect the City of Providence, the director of the department of public works of said city, is hereby directed to announce publicly, not less than twenty-four (24) hours in advance, that said storm may adversely effect said city, via the news, radio and television media; and further shall, by enlisting the aid of the director of the **civilian defense emergency management** preparedness agency, use **civilian defense emergency management** sirens to alert the citizenry starting not less than eight (8) hours, on each hour, in advance of the storm's arrival over said city; the purpose of said siren alerts is to warn motorists to cause all motor vehicles to be removed from the streets of said city.

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An Ordinance limiting residential parking/standing of certain commercial vehicles, as amended.

*Be it ordained by the City of Providence:*

*Section 1.* For the purpose of this Ordinance, a commercial vehicle shall be defined as any vehicle in excess of 20 feet in length and any vehicle over 6,500 pounds gross vehicle weight.

*Section 2.* No commercial vehicle shall park or stand in any residentially zoned area unless engaged in the loading or off-loading of goods.

At any such time the vehicle shall not be idling.

*Section 3.* No vehicle shall park off-street in any front yard area of any dwelling house unless the same shall have been approved for the parking of such vehicles by the appropriate municipal agency.

*Section 4.* No operator of any vehicle shall, while in said vehicle, cross the sidewalk portion of the roadway except at permitted driveway openings to gain access to off-street parking.

*Section 5.* Any person found in violation of any of these sections shall be subject to the penalties enumerated in Section 1-10 herein, but in no case shall any person found in violation hereof be fined less than fifty dollars (\$50.00).

*Section 6.* This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

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Resolution Requesting the Traffic Engineer to prohibit motor vehicle traffic along Bridgham Street from Cranston Street to Westminster Street on Tuesday, August 1, 2000 between the hours of 5:00 o'clock p.m. to 10:00 o'clock p.m. to accommodate the National Night Out 2000.

*Section 5.* All traffic control shall meet all specifications and requirements of the Traffic Engineer.

*Section 6.* Petitioner shall ascertain that there exists no adverse impact on any local utility company.

*Section 7.* During construction of said island and until such time as the City shall officially assume control/ownership over said island and signage, Petitioner shall maintain an insurance policy against loss or claim and it shall name the City of Providence, its officers, employees and agents as additional named insured and shall be for a sum of not less than \$100,000. Said policy shall be approved by the Department of Law of the City of Providence.

*Section 8.* Petitioner shall execute an indemnification and hold-harmless agreement approved by the Department of Law of the City of Providence.

*Section 12.* Petitioner shall comply with all conditions contained herein not later than sixty (60) days from its approval. Upon failure to so comply for any reason, the within resolution shall automatically become a nullity.
