

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 516

Approved October 10, 1974

WHEREAS, the Columbus National Bank of Rhode Island, which was established in 1934, has at the present time twelve branches statewide, with seven branches located within the City of Providence, is now the owner of that 18th Century downtown landmark, the Turks' Head Building, the indenity of which the said Board of Directors of that Bank desire to preserve, and

WHEREAS, the Columbus National Bank of Rhode Island has recently transferred its main office to the Turks' Head Building, and

WHEREAS, the said Turks' Head Building is presently designated by two street addressed, along Westminster Street and along Weybosset Street, which often times confuses patrons, having business in the building,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that in view of the above reported facts the street address of the Turks' Head Building shall be designated as "One Turks' Head Place".
