

Concerning correspondence forwarded to this office relative to various street name changes, kindly be advised that the various street name changes will not affect the operations of the fire department; except however, a problem could arise wherein a street which has existing numerical addresses is split into two sections with different street names, such as Westminster Street is proposed to be.

In order to provide proper emergency response to correct numerical addresses, it would seem that the numerical addresses on a street such as Westminster Street and Verranzano Way should begin and end on the same named street.
