TO THE HONORABLE THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PROVIDENCE

Dear brother Councilmen:

Unfortunately, I will be unable to attend the meeting of the City Council to be held this night, since I am hospitalized for surgery. Therefore, I take this media to transmit to Your Honorable Body my feelings of the events of the immediate past concerning certain actions taken by the school committee in granting the Superintendent of Schools an individual pay increase.

This, to say the least, left me in a state of bewilderment and completely vexed. I do not for a moment, question
the qualifications of Dr. Charles A. O'Connor, Jr., but I do
condemn what I consider the most flagrant misuse of elected
power that the citizens of Providence have ever had to contend
with, namely the action of the school committee in the granting
of this salary increase, and with the explanation which motivated the subject increase.

I am fully aware that the school committee is a separate and distinct entity from the City Council of the City of Providence, enjoying its own autonomy, but it is my considered judgment that the rules of common decency should have dictated that the school committee should have notified Mayor Joseph A.

Doorley, Jr., of its intention of granting this substantial increase in the salary for the Superintendent of Schools, since he is the Chief Executive of the Municipal Government.

School Committee Chairman Raymond F. Fricker's statements, with respect to the reasons for recommending the subsequent granting of such an increase in salary, and the direct denial of these statements by Dr. O'Connor, have planted a deep seed of doubt in my mind as to the veracity of Chairman Fricker's statements concerning matters in the recent past.

I wonder if Chairman Fricker's statements that, "complete chaos in our school system would result in the resignation of Dr. O'Connor", that he is trying to imply that if he were to step down as Chairman, because his word was not accepted as law, that the city school system would collapse.

God knows that since the founding of this great Nation, we have lost some of our most capable leaders, and the Nation has survived progressively.

The school committee and school system is for the benefit of the citizens of Providence and for the education of our children, young adults and adults, and when any one individual or group of persons are of the opinion they are more powerful than the people, it is time for them to step down. We as elected officials are not here to have the people serve us, but rather we are here to serve the people.

I speak now as an individual, and believe that no praise

is high enough for School Committeeman Kapstein, whose actions during the recent events I will support whole heartedly in any censure movement that may be considered.
