

Resolved,

That this City Council, on behalf of the citizens of this City, extends hearty congratulations and best wishes to Rt. Rev. Monsignor Thomas F. Maloney on the occasion of his appointment by His Holiness, Pope John XXIII to be the Auxiliary Bishop of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Providence.

Monsignor Maloney, a native of the Fox Point section and a product of our local schools - Cleary School, LaSalle Academy and Providence College - has had an illustrious career in the Holy Priesthood since his ordination at Louvain, Belgium on July 13, 1930. He served as Chaplain at St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmhurst Academy and St. Mary's Academy at Bayview prior to his assignment to parish work at St. Paul's Church in 1934 which came to a close in 1952 when he accepted the Rectorship of the American College, Louvain, Belgium at the request of Board of Bishops of the United States.

A keen student, a gifted teacher and an astute administrator, the then Father Maloney re-opened the American College at Louvain which had been closed for several years because of World War II, and where his attainments have since merited the many honors bestowed upon him.

In 1955 Pope Pius XII elevated him to the dignity of a domestic prelate with the title of Right Reverend Monsignor, in 1957 the Belgium hierarchy named him Professor Extraordinary of Theology and Providence College awarded him an honorary degree of Doctor of Sacred Theology.

His honors and renown reflect credit on his home diocese of Providence where he is returning to assist the Most Reverend Russell J. McVinney, D.D. in furthering the spiritual needs of more than a half million souls.

It is the desire of this City Council, not only to extend to him hearty felicitations on his elevation as Auxiliary Bishop of Providence but also to assure him of their co-operation in his works of mercy and the fond hope that he will be long spared to pursue his sacred duties.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Resolution be inscribed on the records of this City Council and the City Clerk directed to transmit to Auxiliary Bishop-Elect Maloney an engrossed copy of the same.

the following named person, firm or corporation is hereby ~~granted~~ <sup>That</sup> permission to erect, alter or use a building or structure at the location named herein for the sale of petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil and their products, compounds and components as described and shown in and on the application therefor and accompanying plat, all on file in the Office of the Department of Building Inspection subject to the conditions that said person, firm or corporation shall not violate any of the laws of the State of Rhode Island or any of the Ordinances of the City of Providence relative to the erection, use or occupation of said structure and that said person, firm or corporation shall not allow petroleum, kerosene, gasoline, coal oil or their products, compounds or components, to be conveyed over or across any sidewalk by means of any pipe or hose, and upon such special conditions as are hereby enumerated and further provided that the Director of the Department of Building Inspection may authorize minor changes in the structural detail of plans on file, viz:

Ward 6: John A. & wf. Matilda Zuffoletti, 146 Academy Avenue, Plat 64, Lot 30, 1-3000 gallon gasoline storage tank additional; making a total storage capacity of 11,550 gallons upon the premises.

The erection or location of any buildings or structures not shown on the original plat on file with the Director of Department of Building Inspection, or any change in the location of buildings or structures from that shown on said plat shall be deemed a violation of this permit.

At a meeting of the Zoning Board of Review held on Tuesday, October 27, 1959, the following resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, John A. Zuffoletti, owner of Lot 30 on Assessor's Plat 64 (146 Academy Avenue) in a Commercial C-1 Zone, on September 1, 1959, filed an application for permission to install one additional 3,000 gallon underground gasoline storage tank making a total underground storage capacity of petroleum products of 11,550 gallons on the above described premises, and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on this application by the Zoning Board of Review at its meeting held on Tuesday, October 27, 1959, after public notice as provided by the Zoning Ordinance,

RESOLVED: That the Zoning Board of Review does hereby make an exception to the use district regulations under the Zoning Ordinance and does hereby grant the application of John A. Zuffoletti substantially in accordance with the plans and plot plan filed with said Board.
