

DEPUTY CITY REGISTRAR OF VITAL STATISTICS

CLASS TITLE: Deputy City Registrar of Vital Statistics

CLASS DEFINITION: Responsible administrative work relating to management functions of the department in the absence of the City Registrar.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF WORK: Work involves responsibility for directing and supervising the business management operations of the departments and for supervision of personnel in the department in the absence of the City Registrar.

ILLUSTRATIVE EXAMPLES OF WORK: Maintains or supervises the maintenance of records relating to births, deaths and marriages and also payrolls, supplies and services. Exercises budgetary controls and budget preparation. Supervises personnel and records related thereto. Oversees the collections and dissemination of all information concerned with vital statistics and performs related assignments as required in the absence of the City Registrar. Also performs the duties of a Clerk Stenographer II.

DESIRABLE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS AND ABILITIES: Knowledge of the principles of maintaining records and methods of office management. Skill in developing cooperative and harmonious working relationships within the department. Ability to supervise the execution of approved departments policies.

QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED FOR APPOINTMENT: Graduation from a standard high school. Considerable experience in stenographic and progressively difficult clerical work.



AN ACT in Amendment of Sections 46-14-1 and 46-14-4
of the General Laws, in Chapter 46-14 Entitled
"Contamination of Drinking Water", as Amended.

It is enacted by the General Assembly as follows:

Section 1. Sections 46-14-1 and 46-14-4 of the general laws in chapter 46-14 entitled "Contamination of drinking water" are hereby amended to read as follows:

"46-14-1. Pollution or misuse of drinking water sources prohibited.--No person shall throw or discharge, or suffer to be thrown or discharged, into any well, spring, brook, lake, pond, reservoir or stream used as a source of water supply for drinking purposes by any city, town, district, institution or company, or into any known tributary or feeder of any such well, spring, brook, lake, pond, reservoir or stream, any sewage, drainage, refuse or other noxious matter or thing tending to pollute or corrupt, or impairing or tending to corrupt the purity of the waters of any such well, spring, brook, lake, pond, reservoir or stream, or any known tributary or feeder thereof, or render the same injurious to health. Nor shall any person bathe, swim, wash any animal, clothing^{or} any other article in any of the above-mentioned waters; provided, however, that the provisions of this section shall not interfere with, nor prevent the enriching of land for agricultural purposes by the owner or occupant thereof, if no human excrement is used thereon. Any person violating any of the provisions of this section shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50.00), or by imprisonment for a term not to exceed thirty (30) days, or both.

"46-14-4. Prosecution of violations--Liability for costs.--In addition to other police officers who may prosecute for criminal offenses, the director of health may prosecute

for all violations of this chapter and shall not be required to give surety for costs upon complaints made by him."

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage and all acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL

No. 35

Approved April 9, 1968

WHEREAS, there are presently located in the City of Providence certain structures which are in a dilapidated and deteriorated condition; and

WHEREAS, the City of Providence is vitally interested in the preservation and rehabilitation of neighborhoods throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, the demolition of certain of these structures will serve to promote the preservation and rehabilitation of these neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, the owners of certain of these dilapidated and deteriorated structures are willing to convey title to these structures and to the land upon which they are located to the City of Providence without cost to the City; and

WHEREAS, by the acceptance of these deeds, the City of Providence will be enabled to demolish these structures with funds previously appropriated;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the City of Providence hereby accepts deed in fee simple to the land and buildings hereinafter described from the owners thereof:

Parcel I

That certain parcel of land with all the buildings and improvements thereon situated on the westerly side of Burnside Street in the City and County of Providence and State of Rhode Island, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the westerly line of Burnside Street forty-seven (47) feet, more or less, northerly from the northerly line of Sayles Street, said point of beginning being at the northeasterly corner of land now or lately of Joseph Lucy, and thence running northerly bounding easterly on said Burnside Street forty (40) feet to land now or lately of George W. Garner and wife; thence turning and running westerly bounding northerly on said Garner land sixty-four and thirty-eight hundredths (64.38) feet, more or less, to said Lucy land; thence southerly bounding westerly on said Lucy land forty (40) feet to a corner; thence running easterly bounding southerly still on said Lucy land sixty-four and thirty-two hundredths (64.32) feet, more or less to said Burnside Street and the point or place of beginning.

Parcel II

That certain lot or parcel of land, with all the buildings and improvements thereon, situated on the westerly side of Burnside Street, in the City of Providence and State of Rhode Island, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the westerly side of Burnside Street eighty-seven (87) feet more or less, northerly from Sayles Street and running thence northerly bounding easterly on said Burnside Street a distance of forty (40) feet to land now or lately of Harold V. Floody et ux.; thence turning and running westerly bounding northerly on said Floody land a distance of ninety-nine and 44/100 (99.44) feet to land now or lately of Laura P. Creegan et al.; thence turning and running southerly, bounding westerly on said Creegan land a distance of forty (40) feet to land now or lately of Joseph Lucy; thence turning and running easterly, bounding southerly on said Lucy land in part and in part on land now or lately of Edward W. LaValley, et ux., a distance of ninety-nine and 38/100 (99.38) feet to said Burnside Street at the starting point.


