



To the Honorable Walter H. Reynolds, Mayor, and the Honorable The City Council:

In compliance with Chapter 2, Section 179 $\frac{1}{2}$ , of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Providence, 1946, I submit herewith the Annual Report of the Department of Public Welfare for the fiscal year ended September 30, 1962.

Foreword

The overall cost of the welfare operations of the City of Providence during the past fiscal year has again declined. This is the fourth consecutive year that we in the Department of Public Welfare have had the gratification of reporting a reduction in our expenditures. We again point out that this reflects the firm policy of the Department in transferring General Public Assistance cases to other programs of assistance as speedily as eligibility for them can be established.

The temporary amendment to Title IV of the Social Security Act which was to terminate on June 30, 1962 was extended for a five year period with July 1, 1962 as the initial date. This amendment permits the states to provide Aid to Dependent Children if the parent is unemployed. In the absence of this amendment our costs would have increased markedly and suddenly. In the past there has been federal financial participation in Aid to Dependent Children cases for aid to one of the parents only. A new provision in the Public Welfare Amendments of 1962 extends federal financial participation in these cases to aid for the second parent under certain conditions including incapacity or unemployment. While we welcome this expansion of coverage under the program the impact on General Public Assistance is not likely to be appreciable.

During the past year we completed revisions of Work Management procedures pertaining to filing and controls in our five district offices. This is part of an overall plan for work simplification. Our district office accounting procedures have been transferred to our administrative office. This centralizes the accounting function and provides better control and more readily available information. These far outweigh benefits derived from the decentralized procedure and the release of several clerical employees for other assignments has been a significant gain. Our operation is one of detail and involves considerable paper work. We are obliged to continue efforts to simplify clerical and administrative processes to the extent which protracted study may indicate as feasible and desirable.

Under the State - City integrated form of administration, which has been in effect for many years, our social case workers have caseloads of Old Age Assistance, Aid to Dependent Children, Aid to the Blind and Aid to the Disabled cases along with General Public Assistance cases. The costs of assistance grants under these programs are not reflected in this report since local government does not participate therein. Staff salaries and other administrative obligations are a major item in our expenditures, however, and are included.

Emergency assistance for all of the aforementioned assistance programs can be met through General Public Assistance only. Inasmuch as the number of federal categorical assistance cases in the City of Providence exceeds six thousand the General Assistance program must provide for many pressing needs which arise in the lives of persons who are not recipients of a

General Public Assistance maintenance grant. Regardless of other governmental programs directed toward the amelioration of problems of the individual in society General Public Assistance stands as the last defense against hunger and privation.

We are thankful to have had the invaluable support of a Mayor and City Council based on a steadfast belief in the soundness of the responsibility of government for meeting mass need. The devotion and loyalty of our staff, those who have a difficult and at times a wearying task, have made it possible to accomplish the purposes for which we exist.
