Whereas, A native of Providence, he served the Citizenry of the State of Rhode Island as Governor with pride and distinction, and prior to that high Office, he served as Secretary of State and Lieutenant Governor, and

Whereas, Governor Notte gained prominence in the practice of Law, in the area of politics, and the world of business, civic and religious organizations, and

Whereas, His departure from this life will long be mourned, his achievements will not be easily forgotten and his many monuments will stand indestructible,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That the Members of the City Council do hereby express their sincere sympathy in the death of Governor John A. Notte, Jr., late leader of our community, and offer to his children and his survivors, their condolences upon their irreplaceable loss, and

Be It Further Resolved, That to acquaint his family with the respect in which he was held, a gentle man with humility and trust, the City Clerk is hereby directed to transmit a duly certified copy of this Resolution to his Family.

COUNCIL PRESIDENT PAOLINO and COUNCILMAN O'CONNOR (By Request):

Resolution Authorizing the Rhode Island Port Authority and Economic Development Corporation to Submit on Behalf of the Port Commission and the City of Providence an Application for a Foreign Trade Zone at the Port of Providence.

Whereas, The filing of applications to establish a foreign trade zone is authorized by the United States Foreign Trade Zones and by Rhode Island General Law, 42-26.1-2, and

Whereas, The aforesaid Federal Regulations authorize the Foreign Trade Zone Board to grant corporations the privilege to establish, operate, and maintain a foreign trade zone in or adjacent to a port of entry under the jurisdiction of the United States in order to expedite and encourage foreign commerce and to create and maintain employment through the encouragement of economic activity in the United States which would have otherwise been conducted abroad, and

Whereas, The City of Providence deems it necessary and in the public interest (1) to develop and manage the Port of Providence, a port of entry of the United States, (2) to increase the City's employment base, and (3) to encourage economic activity within the City, and

Whereas, The City of Providence deems it

appropriate to contribute to the aforementioned efforts by promoting the usage of its port facilities by assuring the attraction, retention and expansion of industrial and commercial business at the Port of Providence and by arranging for programs and facilities to serve such businesses and the Citizens of Providence, and

Whereas, Foreign Trade Zones can be established for the activities and undertakings herein proposed.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That:

1. It is hereby found necessary and in the public interest to authorize the Rhode Island Port Authority and Economic Development Corporation to submit on behalf of the Port Commission and the City of Providence, an application to the Foreign Trade Zone Board to establish a Foreign Trade Zone in the State of Rhode Island which will designate certain parcels with the Port of Providence as a Foreign Trade Zone.

2. The Office of Economic Development is hereby authorized and designated as the representative of the City for assisting the Rhode Island Port Authority and Economic Development Corporation in preparing the application, and to lend active support for the approval of such application by the Foreign Trade Zone Board.

3. That the United States of America and the Department of Commerce be, and hereby are, assured of full compliance by the City of Providence with all regulations of the United States Government effectuating the designation, activation and operation of a Foreign Trade Zone under the Foreign Trade Zone Act, as amended.

Whereas, The City Employees' Retirement System has a substantial unfunded liability, and

Whereas, Over the past years the benefits for retired City Employees have been increased from time to time by the General Assembly thereby adversely impacting on said unfunded liability and on the security of benefits payable to present and future retired City Employees, and

Whereas, Such legislation requires an ever greater portion of City revenues to be allocated to contributions to said Retirement System and therefore, results in pressure to increase the tax burden on City taxpayers, and

Whereas, Under the Laws of the State of Rhode Island and the Providence Home Rule Charter, the City Council and the Mayor of the City of Providence have responsibility for setting the City's tax rate and approving a City Budget for expenditure of City revenues, and

Whereas, Under principles of comity and respect for the authority and responsibility of the Government of the City of Providence, it would be desirable for the General Assembly to obtain the views of locally elected officials of the City of Providence on legislation which directly impacts the expenditure of City funds,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, That the
